Pastoral Council Mission Statement

“Speak, Lord, For Your Servant Is Listening!”

There is a “bhajan” which I learned many years ago in India. A “bhajan” is a repetitive song with simple words and enchanting melody. “Bhajans” are sung in religious settings, in personal or communal prayer. One way of understanding them is to say they are like a “sung” Rosary. To some people, it may seem very boring repeating the same tune over and over again. But as you surrender yourself to the “bhajan,” you begin to find that it sings itself; you no longer do the singing, but the “bhajan” itself sings within you.

Why this excursus on “bhajans,” you may ask? Well, Eli’s spiritual advice to Samuel - “Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening” - just happens to be a “bhajan” which spontaneously comes to my heart and lips, often when I least expect it. I’ve probably mentioned this in some homily or other.

“Hay, Prabhu, Bowl Ab Tu: Soon Rahaa Hai Das Thera!”

A clumsy phonetic transcription of the Hindi, but it is the exact translation of Samuel’s response to the Lord’s Voice.

In a real way, that “Speak, Lord” sums up our whole stance in the world, doesn’t it? Our readiness to listen but also our faith that the Lord will indeed speak - is speaking! The circumstances of our lives are the vehicle for God’s communication to us. Not just the events written the **BIG BOLD** letters; but all the circumstances of our lives, be they pleasant, exhilarating, mundane, uplifting, “ordinary,” depressing. Whatever. At every moment God is calling, inviting, challenging perhaps, loving. It is our to say: “Here I am?”

To be-present-to is no easy task in today’s world. There is so much calling to us, sometimes dinning in our ears and hearts. It is no wonder that Jungian psychologists put such emphasis on dream-time. Often enough, that is the only time when the spirit can speak to us and expect to be heard. Like Samuel, we too find the power and mystery of the “I Am” which calls and responds within us. “Here I am, Lord!”

Eli, Samuel’s mentor, finally understood from where the call was coming. It was not a human call requesting some service. It was the Call to which the only response can be: “Speak, I listen. I will do your will.” We must all have personal “bhajan” echoing in our hearts and minds. There must be a willingness to have it there, listen to it, and obey it. Discernment is necessary: “Is it you who called me?” Sometimes, it is very easy to hear and understand the “still, small voice.” At other times we will have to sing our “bhajan” over and over again: “Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening.” But always with faith and the surrender of the devotee.

We must learn to let our “bhajan” sing us to the Lord. When that begins to happen, song and singer will be one - **ONE**.

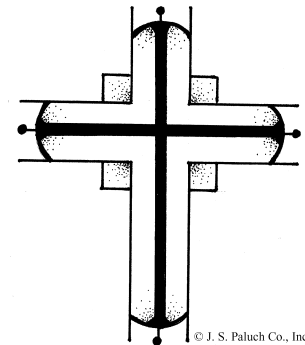

Kindergarten and Preschool News:

Saint Juliana School will continue to offer a full-day and half-day Kindergarten program for the 2006/2007 school year. Enrollment numbers will determine whether the half-day students are in a self-contained classroom or included in a full-day classroom.

Our four-year-old Preschool Program offers classes five days a week from 8:15 – 10:40 A.M. Taking into consideration the demand for morning classes, we will offer two morning sessions. We will offer an afternoon program if there is sufficient enrollment.

Classes for three-year-olds are held on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 8:15 to 10:40 A.M. We will also offer a two-day morning program on Tuesday and Thursday if there is sufficient enrollment.

For an additional fee, students in the three-year-old or four-year-old programs can stay after the morning sessions in the Preschool Day Care program until the afternoon dismissal at 2:40 P.M.
