"Repent and Believe In The Good News"

Now waitaminit! That repentance - stuff is for Lent. We still have some time to relax in "ordinary time" before that.

Today's readings from Scripture remind us that no one becomes a prophet without first repenting. The words "prophet" or "prophetic" are sometimes bandied about these days when the discussion centers on the role of the Church or the Christian in the modern world. Of course everyone wants to be known as a prophet.. There's something heroic about being a prophet: calling people to repentance, casting the accusatory glance at the inequities of life, challenging people to adopt new ways of thinking or acting.

But no one can become a prophet without first personally acknowledging one's selfish choices. Jonah was chosen by God to, as it were, "read the riot act" to the people of Nineveh. He went at it with great zeal - fire and brimstone. But when the Ninevites repented, Jonah was terribly upset with God. He pouted. He expected God to follow his agenda.

In a sense, Jonah was not a true prophet because he did not first repent of his own personal sinfulness and selfishness. He heard the call of God but he did not answer it first by spending time reflecting on himself, and how he himself was contributing to the evil of the situation.

You have only to study the lives of the truly prophetic people in the history of the world. They are not simply people who cause an upheaval or "movement" in their culture or society. The truly prophetic have deep interior lives wherein they are able to see themselves as they themselves are, before they start observing or evaluating others. Because to be a prophet does not simply mean to "call a spade a spade," one must begin the process of prophecy within one's self.

Look at the followers of Jesus. They were not "readymade" apostles, prophets of a new world order. They had first to divest themselves of their prejudices against the Roman occupation, the Sanhedrin, lepers, Samaritans, tax collectors, etc. If they thought they could follow this "Messiah" because he was on "their side," they were soon dissuaded from such a simplistic point of view. Jesus was calling them to repentance before they could be missioned to the world of their time.


Jesus and His followers must have spent many hours in solitude as well as many hours in "group dynamics", arguing, complaining about each other, learning their weaknesses as well as their strengths. A prophet is keenly aware of his/her weaknesses. Those weaknesses can often point to the strengths of the true prophet.

Jesus' prophetic, public life was a mere 3 years. What was He doing all those other years to prepare Himself for His mission? Someone might say: "But did not Jesus do everything perfectly because He was God?" But part of becoming truly human, truly prophetic, implies that we learn. Is repentance a sign of human weakness or is it, perhaps, that we are made "in the Image and Likeness of God"?

"When God saw by their actions how the Ninevites turned from their evil way, He repented of the evil that He had threatened to do them; He did not carry it out..." (Book of Jonah)


