"He Was Obedient Unto Death; Death On A Cross"

"Obedience" and "suffering". Not very pleasant sounding words, are they? Being a person who has lived with a vow of obedience for the last 46 years, I've had to learn the meaning of obedience - correction: Am learning! But I am not the only one who has to learn the true meaning of obeying. Somehow or other, the whole notion of obeying seems to have become synonymous with "suffering," "dying to one's own will" and doing another's.

The root meaning of the word comes from the Latin: "ob-audire," to listen attentively to. One who obeys is a "listener" par excellence. What is important in obedience is not the suffering of doing what someone else wants us to do, but to **LISTEN**. "To-listen-towards," as a crude but perhaps more fruitful translation might have it. Like leaning closer to someone so that you don't miss a word they're saying, especially if there's a lot of peripheral noise in the circumstances surrounding you.

The listening is not to some communication going on "outside" of us. It's not even "listening for the will of God," as if that will is coming from "outside" or across light years of space, from "out there somewhere." It is, rather, a listening to what goes on inside of us (lack of a better metaphor). The notions of "outside" and "inside" are easily understandable, but for that very reason, they can mislead us also. But perhaps the point of listening to our "insides" is a better description of what obedience is.

"He learned obedience from what He suffered." Again we ordinarily connect the notion of suffering with pain or inability and sadness. But to suffer something is merely to undergo it, to experience it from within. Sometimes root meanings of words, their original conceptions, can help us to appreciate the "dearest, deep down things," in the words of the Jesuit poet Gerard Manley Hopkins. To learn obedience from what we suffer is, truly to "listen" to all that goes on in our lives. To be obedient to Life is to listen to It, to allow "It" to do "Its thing" within us and in the universe.

So by listening to all that goes on in and around us, we become "listeners to the Word of God." To obey God is to listen to Her/His word in whatever we suffer (undergo) in life. God speaks to us in all the events of our lives as individuals and as a people. We must learn to listen not only with our ears but with our eyes and hearts as well. Nothing is "mere" suffering, meaningless pain or event. The God Who Is Word communicates to us in all we experience, and assures us continually that nothing will separate us from Love. But we must "obey" the events of our lives - listen to them with faith, hope and love. In the course of time, we will find that we are becoming "obedient" to God in all things; we will pause and listen to all that happens to us.

The joyful realization over time, will be that everything speaks of God's love - we, like Paul, will be able to say with conviction that "ALL THINGS WORK UNTO GOOD FOR THOSE WHO LISTEN (i.e. ARE OBEDIENT)."

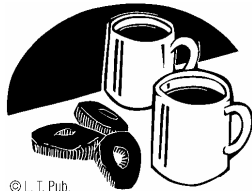

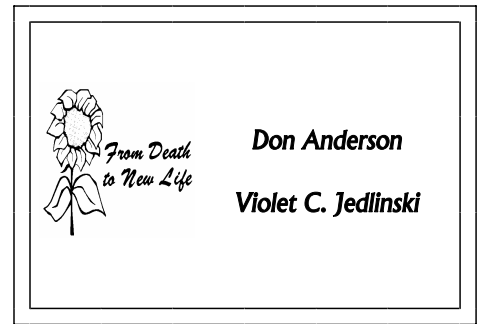

Pro Life News Alert... SB 3170 was introduced by Senators Trotter, Schoenberg and Hunter and has been assigned to the Senate Rules committee. It will appropriate \$15 million to the Department of Public Health from the Tobacco Settlement Recovery Fund for grants and related expenses for the funding of the Illinois Regenerative Medicine Institute (IRMI). These funds will be used for research on human cloning and stem cell research on human embryos pursuant to the Governor's Executive order.
