“He Was Not Able To Perform Any Might Deed There”

“Who the hell do you think you are anyway?!” Thus may have spoken some of the “locals” from Nazareth - maybe even some of Jesus’ relatives. He was becoming something of an embarrassment to the clan with his weird behavior and volatile pronouncements about this, that and the other thing. It was getting so that you couldn’t walk through the village bazaar without someone or other making some snide remark about “your brother the prophet,” or “that outcast cousin of yours.” Of course there were some people genuinely impressed by Jesus’ life-style and friendliness. Every once in a while you’d find him down at the toddy-shop at the crossroads after a day in his shop, surrounded by an assortment of people, some snickering behind open palms, some shocked into listening attentively, others checking to see if any one of the officials from the local synagogue was around.

You got the impression that Jesus, too, felt a bit uneasy with all the scrutiny. After a time his spontaneity lessened and he seemed aware of a general critical attitude which more and more cramped his style. At the toddy-shop and in the bazaar, he would previously have enjoyed holding forth on some local issue or even the Scriptures. But as time went on and he began to sense the opposition of the crowd, he became slower and more circumspect of speech. Oh, he would answer questions and even proffer opinions but he had become more reserved, perhaps even a bit suspicious of people who seemed to be goading or ridiculing him.

I think he most enjoyed the evenings in the company of his Mom, some of her women friends, and some of the elders of the village who seemed less inimical, even curious. Especially when Jesus explained the ancient traditions of their people did these elders and women listen with rapt attention, asking questions which he must have answered to their satisfaction, if the nods of approval and smiles were any indication. They especially liked it when he reawakened in them a strange hope and longing for the time when Adonai would become Emmanuel for them all.

Sometimes the younger crowd would bait Jesus. “You seem to have done some pretty magical things last week in Capernaum and Bethany. Why don’t you do that here? Are we not good enough to see some of your tricks? Don’t we have sick people here? At those times Jesus would remain silent - not beaten down or cowed...just silent. There was a poignancy in that silence, as you’d readily admit if you’d have a poignancy in that silence, as you’d readily admit if you’d have seen it. It was so powerful that you could almost “hear” it. Pretty strange, no? Hearing silence!?”

I sometimes wonder what Jesus would have done if his clan and fellow villagers had believed in him. But there are people in Nazareth even today who won’t admit he was anything special: “Don’t we know his mother and brothers and sisters? Isn’t his father’s shop still there in that back lane?” Well, either you believed in him or you didn’t. Those that did, claim he’s still around here in some kind of magical way.

He’s even got some people who get together and share stories about him and have a little party.

As the DRE in our parish, I run the CCD Program (which has grown over the years by leaps and bounds, with our enrollment this year at 325 students), and I oversee the Sunday School program and our SPRED Program for the disabled. I coordinate the sacramental programs in the parish, including Baptisms, First Communion, Reconciliation and Confirmation. I also help out at school when needed. I would like to see us once again offer some Religious Education opportunities for adults.

As Pastoral Associate, I find my ministry always varied and most always rewarding. Having been employed here for so long, the "job" keeps expanding. I am here in a non-ordained role to be of service to the people of St. Juliana Parish. I oversee and am a part of the Parish Liturgy Team and the Family Liturgy Committee. I work with the Altar Servers, Lectors and Commentators, Communion Ministers and Ushers. It is definitely my joy to be with all these wonderful volunteers at all the weekend and special masses. I am also present for all Weddings in the parish to help make the day go smoothly for the wedding couples. I also coordinate the volunteers who wash the altar linens and those who make baptismal bibs for our parish baptisms.

I have worked under 5 pastors since I've been here – Msgr. Michael Kilbride; Msgr. Martin Howard; Father Don Ahearn, Father Phil Dressler and now Father Steve Kanonik. All were and continue to be wonderful spiritual leaders for our parish. I have also been privileged to work with many fine priests over these 32 years. I feel we have been very blessed at St. Juliana Parish with the wonderful Priests and Deacons we have had and continue to have. Our Parish Staff is also made up of caring, giving and loving people, whom I consider friends, not just fellow employees..

If I can ever be of help to anyone, you can find me at my office in the Parish Center every day but Thursday (my day off) or at Church during all the weekend Masses. I am also around most evenings during the week with meetings for various groups.

I thank God for the opportunity to be a part of this wonderful parish (both as an employee and as a registered parishioner). Each time a new pastor arrives, I hope that I will still have a job. Father Steve has been here for 6 months now and I'm still employed! So, I look forward to serving the people of St. Juliana for many years to come.

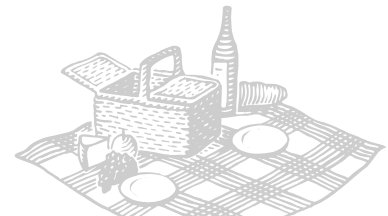

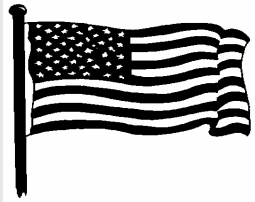

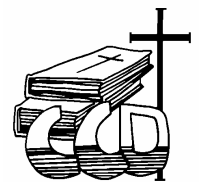
