"In Him We Were Also Chosen"

To think of myself as "chosen" by God has an element of terror in it. It's one thing to volunteer for something. Quite another to be "chosen" for something. In a way, there's the "rub." Being "chosen" seems to imply "chosen for something, chosen to do something, chosen to undergo something - at its worst: to suffer something." To volunteer for something seems much less threatening, doesn't it? When you volunteer, it's you who choose; you are not chosen.

Sometimes life seems a little like the old military joke where the sergeant asks for "volunteers" to take two steps forward. The wise-guys surround the hapless victim and take two steps backwards, leaving the "volunteer" standing alone. "Hey, waitamin!" Doesn't it seem at times that someone "volunteered" us for this life of ours? In that sense, being chosen is not so fortuitous.

From the lives of the Prophets we have examples of people who ended up standing alone while others took "two steps backwards." From Moses to John the Baptist, there's a tradition of chosen people being exposed to not so pleasant people or events. Even the "Chosen People" complained: "If we're your chosen ones, O Lord, then we'd hate to see the people you don't like!"

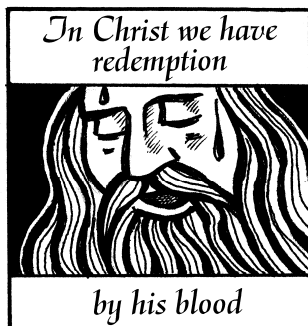
The Letter to the Ephesians says: "In Christ, we were also chosen, destined in accord with the purpose of the one who accomplishes all things according to the intention of His will, so that we might exist for the praise of His glory, we who first hoped in Christ."

To be "chosen in Christ" is an invitation to enter into God's own life. More than an invitation; it is the assurance of God's abiding love, which accomplishes what it sets out to do. It's like the desert - experience of the Israelites where they began to doubt that Yahweh could do what He said He could do - save them from the Egyptians and weld them into His own people.

The point is that even we as individuals have been chosen. The proof of that is that we are aware of being alive. One might counter that with: "But how many of us are truly aware that we are alive? Look at the poverty in the world, the inhumanity perpetuated by so-called "humans," the injustice, etc." Rather than say with the Israelites in the desert: "Take us back to captivity and slavery because life was certain and our direction clear there...," we must hear the resounding command of Moses in Deuteronomy: "CHOOSE LIFE!"

Often you hear people say: "Man, this is really living!" Sometimes they're referring to a good meal, a drink, a picnic, time with friends. In some way, that is true. These experiences are shadows of what real life is. But nothing will fully satisfy a heart made for and chosen by God. God has not chosen us to do a job. God has chosen us the way a woman or a man chooses their husband or wife - to be one with; and be loved by. When God says: "I want you," it's not the drill sergeant looking for volunteers. It's the Lover speaking to the beloved.

I, however was not so sure. The bulletin was done on a COMPUTER - I didn't even know how to turn one on! and all I knew about a mouse was that it was a disgusting little rodent.

After many, many long hours, help from Joanne, patience and encouragement from the rest of the staff, I managed to produce a bulletin every week. I wish I could say that it was and is mistake free but you all know that is not true. The bloopers that have been made over the years, though inadvertent, are fodder for another bulletin article.

I am always learning thanks to the **patience** of our resident computer experts Jeanne Anderson and Father Steve. And just when I think I've got it - there is something new!

Let me take this opportunity to remind you to get your mass intentions in as soon as possible. This may alleviate any mistakes and/or omissions. If it is inconvenient for you to come in the office, feel free to call us at any time. Please know that I appreciate and know how important the mass intentions are to you. Those of us who work in the office are thankful for your continued understanding and patience.

I would be remiss if I did not mention the kindness and consideration of my coworkers - friends. My mother has undergone 3 serious surgeries in the last 2 1/2 years. I had to be with her for surgeries, therapy, doctor appointments, etc. Never a problem! Just two weeks ago my mother needed another surgical procedure & it happened to be the same day Diane was leaving for her Florida vacation. Joyce and Pam to

the rescue! (Matthew 7.7 **"Ask & you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you"**). I didn't even have to ask. They assured me they would take care of the office. I know that if Diane didn't have plane reservations she would have postponed her vacation so that I could be with my mother. That's the way it is at St. Juliana's. I am blessed to work in such a place.

After attending the 8 week minister of care class over 10 years ago I was mandated by the Archdiocese to be a minister of care and administer the Eucharist to the sick. I chose to do so at Lutheran General one Friday a month. Words cannot express the blessings I receive from this ministry. The faith I witness every time I say "The Body of Christ" to those who receive the Eucharist never ceases to take my breath away. (John 6.35 **"I am the bread of life,"** Jesus told them. **"Those who come to me will never be hungry; those who believe in me will never be thirsty."**)

St. Juliana's Bereavement Ministry assists families in planning the funeral liturgy for their deceased loved ones. When my father passed away 15 years ago Fred & Marge Ludwig, members of this wonderful ministry helped us immeasurably with what was a very difficult time. They helped us choose appropriate readings and readers, and beautiful songs for his funeral & listened to my family tell endless stories about my father's life and faith. The Ludwig's shared their faith and knowledge of scripture with us on one of the saddest days of our lives.

I was asked to join this ministry several years ago. I believe the grace of the Holy Spirit (John 14.26 **"But the Holy Spirit will come and help you, because the Father will send the Spirit to take my place. The Spirit will teach you everything and will remind you of what I said while I was with you."**) has helped me minister to many of our bereaved parishioners in prayer and faith sharing. My intent is to help others at this difficult time and once again I receive more than I give.

To say I "work" at St. Juliana Parish, or that my "job" is bulletin editor, or that I answer phones... does not really do it justice.

I have learned much, made many friends, and most importantly, grown in my faith, thanks to all I have had the privilege of working with and all of you - St. Juliana Parish.

There is nothing I would rather be doing....except maybe...singing back up for Tina Turner.

I have a bulletin to produce & I think I need to have it proof read. Don't u agree? St. Jude are u listening?

Sorry, this article is so long - the blessing is - it is the only article of mine you will have to endure.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

On July 1, twenty parishes of the Archdiocese of Chicago will receive new pastors. This new pattern of assigning pastors according to a yearly schedule should result in greater continuity of pastoral governance, fewer temporary administrators of parishes and easier preparation for priests and parishioners as changes are made.

When we profess in the Creed that we believe in an "apostolic Church," we are saying that Christ wills that his people be governed by ordained bishops and priests. The methods of assuring the Church's governance are adapted according to many circumstances, but the assigning of bishops and priests is never merely an administrative action; it is an exercise of faith.

I ask all Catholics of the Archdiocese to pray for the priests newly assigned and the parishes they will serve. I also ask everyone to pray for all the priests of the Archdiocese, for our seminarians and for those who are now being called by God's grace to serve here as priests.

I am grateful to all our priests, especially those newly assigned this year. Their obedience to this new call fulfills the promise they made when they were ordained. As we all know, a promise is often easier to make than to keep. These are faithful priests who are keeping their ordination promises, and all of us should be proud of them.

May the Lord bless you and your families this summer. You are in my prayers; please keep me in yours.

SENT BY GOD

In Amos' time the vocation of prophet had achieved a very formal status in Israel. The prophets had arisen, originally, to act as God's voice when Israel was no longer led by the spiritual/civil figures known as "judges," but by monarchs. Over time, the monarchy had appropriated the offices of priest and prophet, established them into companies, and reserved the right to appoint courtly prophets. Then, as now, when those in power also got to choose who would act as their official conscience, things sometimes went awry. At such times, God raised up prophets from unlikely places, and this is how Amos received his vocation as prophet. In last week's Gospel we heard how Jesus was raised up as God's anointed from a place many viewed as unlikely. As we continue to discern our own vocation as baptized disciples, we can be assured that we are, in Paul's words, "chosen, destined in accord with the purpose of the One who accomplishes all things according to the intention of his will" (Ephesians 1:11).
