"In Christ Jesus, You Who Once Were Far Off Have Become Near By the Blood of Christ"

"For He is our peace, He who made both one, and broke down the dividing wall of enmity, through His flesh, abolishing the law with its commandments and legal claims, that He might create in Himself one new Person in place of the two, thus establishing peace, and might reconcile both with God, in One Body, through the cross, putting that enmity to death by it. He came and preached peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near, for through Him we both have access in one spirit to the Father."

Forgive the long quote from today's Second Reading, but it is a powerful one in the light of the various "enmities" we are experiencing in today's world. Obviously, St. Paul is referring to the enmity between Jews and Gentiles, emphasizing that the Blood of Christ has washed away the difference between the "chosen people" and the "non-chosen people." Hooray! Everyone is CHOSEN!

We have gotten accustomed to the dichotomy: Jews and Gentiles. The Bible -Old and New Testaments makes the difference and, before you know it, it becomes a kind of mind set. It gets unconsciously reinforced with popular notions of "good guys vs. bad guys."

Along comes Jesus and He blows away the neat and tidy, black and white world the Jews had become accustomed to. He lives with no obvious behavioral distinctions or classifications of people. He is the One who will unite the near and the far in the Mystery of His own Blood poured out for all - and I do mean ALL! He has inherited none of the "enmities of His people: not against the Romans, not against the Greeks, not against the Syro-Phoenicians, not against the Africans, not against the Egyptians--well, you get the idea, no?

In a sense, Jesus does not have to "forgive" these people for being who they are. Nor does He make an excuse for being Jewish. People are who they are for Him. And He is who He is for them. It seemed to be impossible for Him to "take sides" with one ethnic group over another. The notion of a favored people itself seems inimical to His whole life-style: Pharisees invite Him, Sadducees invite Him, money-changers invite Him, some talk to Him in public, children nestle in his arms, Romans are respectful of Him and He of them.

It is only people who feel threatened by His universality who find Him hard to take, unclean, dancing to a different tune. But He remains the One who will create in Himself one new Person in place of the many. Through His Blood all shall become like Him, reconcilers, putting enmities to death by the Blood of Christ, preaching peace to those who are far off and peace to those who are near.

"When Jesus disembarked and saw the vast crowd, His heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd: and He began to teach them many things." Not the least of which was that: ALL ARE WELCOME!

Through active listening we strive to determine and understand the diverse needs of our parish and community. We minister to these needs by inviting and empowering others to become involved in meeting the spiritual, temporal and social needs of all.

We partner with the Pastor and Staff to support existing parish life, to create vision, and to plan for the future.

Hello to all. My name is Cindy Brennan and I am the Health Activities Coordinator at St. Juliana Parish and have been the coordinator for 3 years. I have been working at Resurrection Medical Center for 30 years and bring to this job 25 years of emergency room experience.

I was asked by Father Phil to assume the responsibilities of health activities coordinator for the parish. I was flattered and excited to be considered and happy to be of service to my parish. It is something I always wanted to do but was unsure of how to go about doing so.

My love for nursing and helping people prompted me to gladly say YES to Father Phil's request to help our parishioners with their health care needs.

There was really no job description when I began this ministry other than the monthly blood pressure screening in the vestibule of the church. I was interested in offering more services so I began to think of what else could I provide to the parish.

I coordinate & participate in the following services at St. Juliana Parish:

- Blood Pressure Screening, monthly, in the Parish Center during Coffee, Tea & Thee. Regular blood pressure screenings enables parishioners to have their pressure monitored regularly. I follow-up on those with high pressure readings, refer them to their physicians & hopefully save them from further serious health issues. This service has enabled me to meet great people and developed great friendships with those who participate and it also gives me great satisfaction. I couldn't provide this valuable service without my volunteer nurses and greeters. I am very grateful for their generous spirits.
- I also coordinate and administer yearly flu shots to the parish at a very low cost. I am happy to make home visits for those who are unable to come to the parish.
- I helped obtain donations for the purchase of the AED (automatic external defibrillator) from generous parish groups and parishioners. It is located in the Ahearn Activity Center. Soon there will be one in our church. Being a certified CPR instructor qualifies me to certify designated parish personnel (every year) so as to insure the proper use of this life saving machine.
- Along with Resurrection Medical Center, I coordinate Health Screening here which consists of a blood test that includes Cholesterol, Glucose, Thyroid & PSA for men. These tests are given at a nominal fee in the Parish Activity Center. The confidential lab results are mailed to those screened and recommendations are made accordingly. Please watch this bulletin for the next screening date.
- St. Juliana School students must provide yearly medical and dental forms in order to be enrolled. I review every form submitted to make sure they are completed correctly. This state requirement is very tedious but necessary.

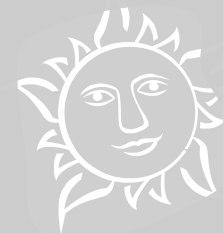

Christ's Presence in THE WORLD

There's a bit of a "missing link" in the first two sentences of today's Gospel from Mark. In the first, the apostles return from having been sent out on mission two by two ("one who is sent" is the meaning of "apostle"). Their instructions were to preach repentance, drive out demons, and heal the sick in Jesus' name. In the second sentence, Jesus tells them to come away with him and rest a while. It would be nice for us to imagine that, between those two sentences, a look of amazed gratitude and pleasure crossed the face of Jesus as he hears of the kingdom proclaimed in his name, and how they didn't have to shake the dust off their feet anywhere. They deserved a rest! It might not be bad for us, when we gather together with Jesus as the apostles do today, to do this kind of debriefing, allowing the Lord to hear what we've sought to do in his name, our successes, our failures, our need to get away with him for a while to be fortified for further work in God's name. For we, the baptized, are not only the flock of Jesus Christ; through water and the power of the Spirit we have also become the Body of Christ, the presence of the Shepherd for the life of the world.
