"Be Imitators of God, As Beloved Children...and Walk In Love"

Now that's scary. Imitate heroes and heroines. Imitate the saints. Imitate the happy, the successful, the courageous. But "imitate God!" It's hard enough trying to be human, and along comes someone and says: "Be imitators of God, as beloved children."

I think the crux of my problem is that I do not really understand the power, the divineness of love. When I use the word "love," I feel that I know what I'm talking about. You know: Love your neighbor! Love your enemies! I'm thinking that love is something or some action that I can do just because I'm human. Everyone can love; so what's the big deal, right? Wrong! The deal is that love is not natural to us humans. Maybe we've gotten too comfortable with the motion of "love" being part and parcel of our "nature."

We certainly see enough attempts at depicting love on T.V. and in the films. We even read a lot about what love does, how it acts. But maybe LOVE is really quite foreign to us as mere humans. In that sense, a lot of the sexual activity in the media would be doing us a great favor, because it helps us realize that love is more than that - much, much more! Oh, there are some people, I suppose, who really resonate with some of the explicitness about sex which has crept into the media. An argument might even be made that the promoters of such explicitness are just showing us "what comes naturally" to humans. Why hide it behind old fashioned regulations and prudery? Humans do this, no? So then it's fair game for our cameras, recorders, and printed material.

Maybe I've really not gotten into the depth of feeling in our soap operas, but I know that I never get tear-eyed watching any of the love scenes. Maybe some people do. I don't. But show me reruns of Touched by an Angel or Joan of Arcadia or Promised Land or some parts of E.R. and such like programs, and I'm sniffing and getting misty-eyed. Heck! I get that way often when I watch a segment of "Someone You Should Know," when Harry Potterfield on Channel 7 spotlights someone who is doing a wonderful bit of social service or something really artistic. Now someone might say: "Degustbus non disputandum" ("You can't argue about peoples' tastes"). That's true - up to a point.

Real love brings mist to the eyes, a lump in the throat, and a wonderful, warm feeling in one's whole body. It's a "total" experience and makes you go away spontaneously thanking God. Because that's what love is, no? LOVE IS GOD IS LOVE.

"Be imitators of God...Live in love." the grace to imitate God is just that - a grace; a free, unmerited gift. It doesn't come with the territory," as the saying goes. We are humans and therefore we love. No. We love because God shares Her/His life with us. For centuries humans struggled to find what it was that defined them. Prophets came, seers, holy women and men who questioned, sought, lived. In the fullness of time, God revealed in Jesus Christ that the essence of God and the essence of humans was in LOVE. Humans would find their perfection in imitating God, empowered to do so by a GIFT from God. As humans loved, they would discover their true identity as God's Beloved Children. The truth would be known only to those who love as God loves - to those who imitate God.

MORNING ARRIVAL: During the first two days of school, August 24 and 25 students will gather in the school parking lot near the sign indicating grade levels. The teachers will help students organize into correct homerooms. Please respect our **"NO TRAFFIC ZONES"** around the school. On school days only, our school parking lot and parts of Oketo and Osceola Avenues will be closed to all car traffic from 7:55 to 8:20 AM to provide the necessary safety for all students.

After the first two days of school, students may enter the building from any door on Osceola or the parking lot. The doors will open at 8:05 AM. Bike riders may lock their bikes on the racks located on the Oketo side of the parking lot by the Junior High entrance.

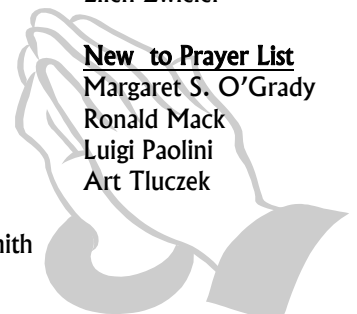

How Does Your Faith Fit Into Your Life?

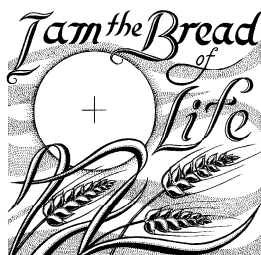
- Do you have questions about God, or concerns about how God belongs in your life?
