Through active listening we strive to determine and understand the diverse needs of our parish and community. We minister to these needs by inviting and empowering others to become involved in meeting the spiritual, temporal and social needs of all.

We partner with the Pastor and Staff to support existing parish life, to create vision, and to plan for the future.

“As For Me And My Household, We Will Serve The Lord.”

We are a society of “shoppers.” We look for bargains - how to get the most for our money. We test items on display by feeling, weighing, pressing buttons, taking test drives, inquiring from sales personnel, comparing products, waiting for prices to drop, studying warranties and guarantees, etc. Once we have decided to commit ourselves to buying an item or investing in something, we are loathe to change our decision except for very serious reasons - perhaps some new information we have not considered while making our original choice.

If you are like me, you tend to go with products and people who have lived up to their advertising. Maybe you’ve been using a certain item or dealing with a certain company for many years - maybe even your parents dealt with that company or used that product and it is a “family tradition” of sorts. But the important thing is that you get “results” which are in some sense measurable, quantifiable. We hear that in the advertisements all the time, don’t we? You get “whiter, brighter, faster, louder, easier, more reliable” results.

How about our choice of the God Whom we will commit ourselves to? Do we not, in some sense, tend to use similar touchstones in choosing a God Whom we will serve? The Israelites always seemed to come up against that in the early years of their relationship with Adonai (Yahweh). They easily fell prey to advertising: “If you follow our god, you will get this, that, or the other benefit.” Sometimes it didn’t take much to change their allegiance from Yahweh to some other, seemingly more powerful, or less demanding god.

I guess it’s just human nature to want to see results, whether from some product we are buying or investing in, or from God. The problem, of course, is that one does not **CHOOSE** God at all. The mystery of human existence is that God **CHOOSES** us, not we God. This is a difficult concept in a society where we are badgered by advertising; where we have grown to think that I - the - consumer have some sort of ultimate say in the matter of what I do or don’t buy or use. Nothing rings more loudly throughout Salvation History than the loving admonition of God: “You have not chosen me; I have chosen you and sent you out to bear much fruit.”

Perhaps Judas was not so far off when he asked: “Is it I, Lord? The fact that I exist at all is a matter of continuing choice on the part of God. No amount of reflection on human freedom will ever change the essential reality that God chose me **TO BE!** With great magnanimity and love, God asks me: “And now. Will you choose me?” Peter was right-on when he said: “Master, to whom shall I go; you have the words of eternal life!”

We don’t make a “deal” with God. We **SURRENDER** to Him/Her, believing that as She/He has called us into existence, so we shall be preserved forever and ever and ever and ever in the instant “**I AM**” Who is God, the Original and only **REALITY**.

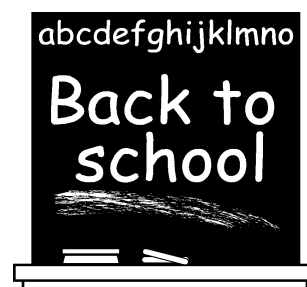

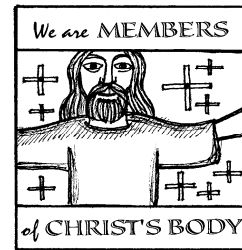
