Respect Life Sunday

When you hear “respect life”, you probably think that the Church would like us to deal with the whole issue of Pro-Life. Of course there are a lot of other issues involved with that one. Biogenetics, stem cell research and treatment of certain ailments. Mind boggling to try to keep up with all, isn't it?

Respect for life. If we put it in everyday terms, perhaps we will find there is a lot to be desired. Or, to put it positively, there's plenty of potential for respecting life. It's not limited to the scientists or the theologians or the highly skilled medical professionals. Respect for life is not just a decision not to have an abortion.

Respect for life begins when we see one of our children “punching out” a little companion and we take him by the hand and say “Bobby, we don't do things like that. Now say you're sorry to your friend Georgie.” Who is the “we” who don't do things like that? Is it just people in general, a nameless blob of humans. Or is the “we” us, our family. “Our family doesn't do things like that, Bobby!”

Saying you're sorry respects the life of another person, whether that person is 2 or 42 years old. “I'm sorry” is to a social convention which simply smoothes things over so that you can continue to get what you want from that person; whether it's equal time on the swing in the yard or acknowledgement at the next cocktail party. Respecting life is its own reward. We don't “use it” to get something else we might have our eyes on. Kids might do that, but we try to teach them that politeness, respecting other peoples' rights or convenience is the “way life is lived.”

When I was a kid, I delighted in stomping on ants. Can you imagine that! Just for the fun of it! I would search them out and if they got into the cracks in the sidewalk, I would wait until they came out and played the merciless giant to their diminutiveness. Respect for life? Hey, man! These bugs and ‘creatures’ are here for my pleasure. Whassa problem?”

What about using a cell phone in a public place? Respect for life, eh? How about driving down a side street at 40 miles an hour? Or maybe littering the public sidewalk or the street? Gossiping the life out of someone? Making crude jokes about different ethnic groups? Killing someone's reputation? Respect for life indeed!!

The need to respect life is necessary in our lives from the very beginning of our consciousness as we learn to live as humans. In fact, there is no other way to be **HUMAN.**

Some More of Father Phil's Ramblings—Retired, not Tired

Being retired, I have much more time to read and prepare homilies for Sunday liturgy. Recently I read an article by Bishop Robert Moreau on spirituality that really caught my interest. I would like to share parts of that article with you. Now that I'm over 70 years of age I forget quite easily, so writing things down helps me remember.

In the article, Bishop Moreau refers to C. S. Lewis' book, *The Screwtape Letters*. Screwtape is the devil and his incompetent nephew, Wormwood, is a junior devil. Screwtape offers Wormwood suggestions on how to successfully tempt people. Yes, there is still a devil and yes, he or she does still tempt.

Though quite humorous in many ways, *Screwtape's* suggestions are truly painful struggles we all must experience. *Screwtape* offers 3 temptations to his nephew:

Prayer:

- whenever there is prayer there is danger of God's immediate action;
- prayer makes men and women vulnerable to God's activity in our lives;

So tempt people not to pray.

Music & Silence: *Screwtape's* abhorrence to both: "I detest them both!"

- what would we do without hymns that praise and thank our God?
- what would we do without quality silence that makes possible our hearing God's whisper?

So, keep people in discord rather than harmony, and encourage them to shout at each other.

Wooing: *Screwtape* makes a profound statement: "God cannot ravish, God can only woo!"

- were God to ravish us, we would lose our freedom and our nature would be destroyed, so God entices by love in 10,000 ways, and God gives us the freedom to choose: yes or no.

So, *Screwtape* and *Wormwood* - the devil and his apprentice - tell us, the believers, to pray, to sing, to listen in silence and to allow God to woo us with his love.

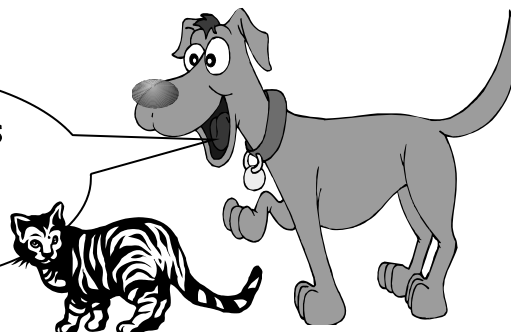

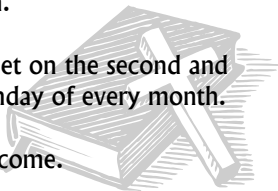

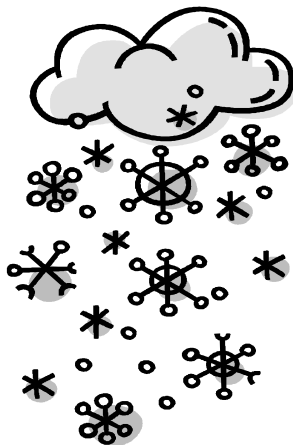

SNOW SHOVELING SIGN UP NOW!!

Every year a group of seventh and eighth graders from our school volunteer to shovel snow. They eagerly sign up for this project in the fall and look forward to serving those in our parish who need their walks shoveled. Questions asked when parishioners call are: when will there be notification that a student is assigned, boys vs. girls shoveling snow, and is there is any kind of fee involved.



Mrs. Lidgus, a teacher at St. Juliana has been extremely generous with her time in gathering students who would like to shovel snow. In October she obtains a list of seventh and eighth graders who would like to provide this service.

When parishioners start calling about snow shoveling, students who live nearest the parishioner are matched to provide the service. The student is asked to contact the parishioner before the snow falls and together arrangements are made as to when he/she should come to shovel. After these arrangements are made parishioners are asked to deal directly with the student, not the parish business office. We cannot guarantee boys or girls to shovel snow. It is most disheartening when a student visits a parishioner to make arrangements for shoveling and is told they are not wanted because they are female and may not be strong enough to shovel. One student is assigned to shovel for a household, please let us know if you have a large area to shovel, then two students will be assigned. Saint Juliana students shovel after school has ended for the day, they cannot come before the school day starts. Please do not ask to be put on the snow shoveling list if neighbors and relatives will be shoveling for you. It is not fair to a student to be on a stand by basis when another job could be assigned to him/her.

Concerning our students getting paid: parishioners who call want to give our students some kind of gratuity. The amount is strictly up to your discretion and should be discussed when the student contacts you.

Please note that it is impossible to have someone shovel for you on the day of a snow storm, on a weekend, or on holidays as students are not in school. It is important to be put on the snow shoveling list now before the snow falls.

On Sunday, October 8th we will celebrate the communal Anointing of the Sick at the Noon Mass. The actual anointing will take place after the homily.

The priest first lay's his hands on the persons head, asking the Holy Spirit to come down upon those who are sick, to strengthen them, and then anoints them on the forehead and on the hands, saying:

"Through this holy anointing may the Lord in His love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit.

May the Lord who frees you from sin, save you and raise you up."

Who Can Be Anointed?

- ✠ Those who are seriously ill.
- ✠ Those who are temporarily ill.
- ✠ Those who are chronically ill. (heart condition, asthma, arthritis...)
- ✠ Those who are emotionally troubled.
- ✠ Those who are over 65 years of age.
- ✠ Those who are preparing for surgery in the near future.
- ✠ Sick children who have reached the age of reason.

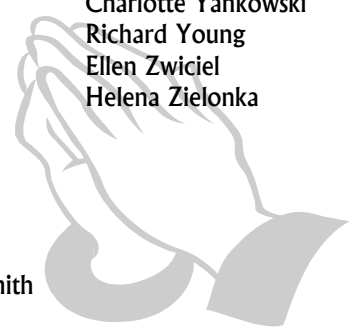
