To Know You Is To Love You

"You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength...You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

All your heart...all your soul...all your strength. Pretty powerful stuff, no? The notion that God wants to be loved by us is itself quite extraordinary. After all, for God to presume that our relationship with Him/Her is based on love is awesome! Maybe "like," but "love"!?

Imagine getting a passionate love letter from someone you don't know. It might be grounds for reporting such a person to the police as a potential "stalker". "Love me with all your heart, all your soul, and all your strength!" Hey! Who are you anyway!?

No one can "command" the love of another person. A prerequisite of love is knowledge. Oh, you can be infatuated, have a "crush," on someone. In my teens, I was a member of the Betty Grable fan club. (Harry James was simply not in the picture!) I remember how utterly embarrassed I was at a family gathering when my Mom announced to all present that "Bob belongs to Betty Grable's fan club!" Ooooooh! I was mortified - dead!

Can one have a "crush" on God - be infatuated with God!? If it's only that, what's all this business about "all your heart, all your soul, and all your strength?!" That's love talk. There's deep passion in that kind of response, whether it's made to God or to another human. God is not ready to play "second fiddle" to anyone in our lives. At the same time, God knows that we have to have a human experience of the kind of love God desires from us. After all, if I could not understand in human emotional terms what "all heart, all soul, and all strength" means, how would I even know if I'm falling or already have fallen in love with God.

Our own human experience is the sacrament which reveals what God is talking about. God wants nothing less than what we give to those who are at the center of our emotional lives. He/She wants us to daydream, to spend time, to feel ourselves moved at the very core of our beings, to listen, to embrace, to share, to be passionate with - all that makes up love, as we know and experience it in our human lives.

But to fall into such love, such a depth of love, one must know the beloved, whether that beloved is an intimate human friend (husband, wife, sibling, etc.) or God. Love is the fruit of frequent, ultimately deeply intimate, contact. One does not fall in love with God by listening to a "commandment". Loving God, falling in love with God, requires "dating" God with the serious intent of "marrying" God in true covenantal style. It means taking God to meet your family and friends, your favorite places where you feel most yourself, sharing your strengths and weaknesses, your dreams for the future.

Have you ever whispered to someone you love dearly: "To know you is to love you"? God likes to hear things like that too, you know.

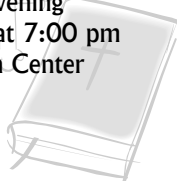

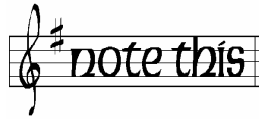
