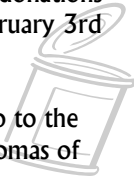

"Before I Formed You In The Womb I Knew You"

These words were spoken to the Prophet Jeremiah. They validated his career as one sent to the nations. It continues: **BEFORE YOUR WERE BORN I DEDICATED YOU, A PROPHET TO THE NATIONS.**

What we sometimes fail to appreciate is that the same can be said of each and every human being born into this world. We are all chosen. We are all dedicated. We are all appointed... before we are formed in the womb of our Moms! That's pretty awesome stuff, no?

How does that express itself in our lived experience? One way is in our expanding consciousness of other people. In our Mom's wombs, we seem to be alone, nurtured in the darkness of total envelopment. But it is not long before we are thrust, as it were, into a world of other people. In fact, in most cases, it is other people who help us enter that world.

But there remains in us a primordial need to be enveloped, to "belong." Our nurturing involves other people and establishes relationships which protect, while they allow and foster growth. Mom and Dad, then the wider family of brothers and sisters, grandparents, aunts, uncles, cousins, neighbors, schoolmates, the "crowd" ("that ole gang of mine!"), etc. Even our religious affiliation provides us with a group of people with whom to belong, or, as the youngsters might put it: "with whom to hang."

One's ethnicity also provides, for a time, a place of refuge and identity. It is all a nurturing. But, in our hearts the words always echo: "Before you were born I dedicated you, a prophet to the nations." There is an outward thrust in all of us to ever remind us of our origins in the Heart of God.

For the Jewish people of the time of Jesus, the end-point had been reached. They were the chosen people of God. And all others?! In a sense, the Jews began to return to the womb - they began to "curl in" on themselves. They chose the darkness of certitude rather than the sometimes unclarity of the light.

What is it that Jesus said in the synagogue of His home-town that evoked such a response: "When the people heard this, they were all filled with fury. They rose up, drove Him out of the town, and led Him to the brow of the hill to hurl Him down headlong!!" It must have sounded like: "GOD IS THE GOD OF ALL HUMANS; GOD LOVES EVERYONE." God chose to help a widow in Zarephath in Sidon. God chose to cure Naaman the Syrian.

God belongs to no one...everyone belongs to God.

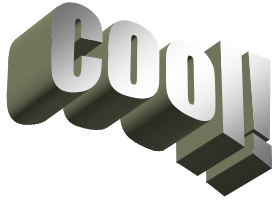

Classes for three-year-olds are held on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 8:15 - 10:45 A.M. We will also offer a two-day morning program on Tuesday and Thursday if there is sufficient enrollment. For an additional fee, students in the three-year-old or four-year-old programs can stay after the morning sessions in the Preschool Day Care program until the afternoon dismissal at 2:50 P.M. 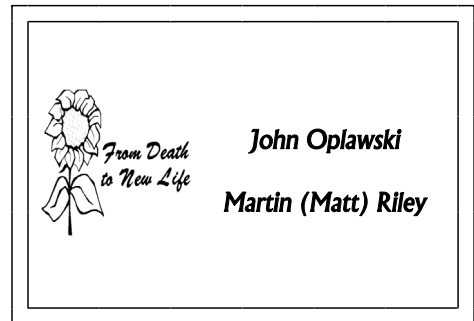

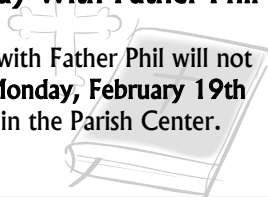

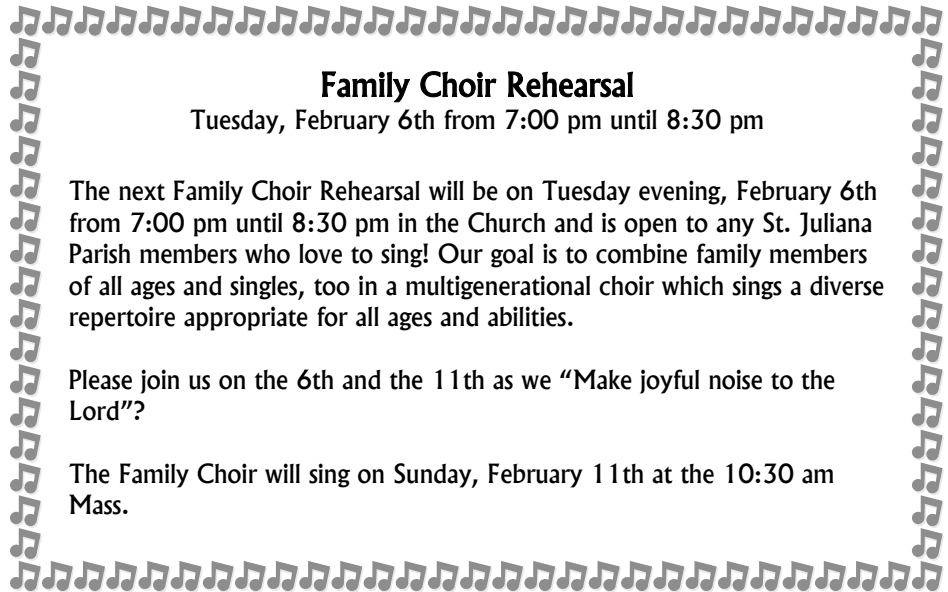
