"Teacher, This Woman Was Caught In The Very Act Of Committing Adultery..." "Before they were married, Mary Was Found To Be Pregnant..."

Today's Good News has the incident involving a hapless woman caught in adultery. Tomorrow's feast, the Annunciation, also involves a woman seemingly guilty of sexual indiscretion - to put it mildly! I must admit that I never thought of the two events as related, other than the fact that both involve serious religio-cultural elements. Some might even say that the events indicate the one-sidedness of Jewish morality, i.e. women at the mercy of men.

This is the beauty of pondering and praying over Scripture texts that we have heard proclaimed many times in our lives. Jesus says to the woman brought to Him for judgment: "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you? Then neither do I. Go, and from now on do not sin any more." God says to Joseph: "Do not be afraid to take Mary to be your wife. For it is by the Holy Spirit that she has conceived."

In the past, I have tended to think of Jesus as the hero of the incident with the woman caught in adultery. I have also thought of God as the "operative factor" in the story of Mary's pregnancy while she's engaged to Joseph - sort of, "Oh sure, God will take care of things!"

From the human point of view - and that's the point of view that Jesus consistently invites us to reflect on even vis a vis His Divinity - the husband of the woman in John's Good News and Joseph in Matthew's Good News have a heroic quality which can easily be overlooked. Just imagine the "adulterous" woman returning to her home, her clothing and hair disheveled, her face stained with dirt commingled with tears. The news of what happened would certainly have preceded her. There is no indication from the story that she is a prostitute.

Did her husband welcome her back? The Law was on his side; he could have tossed her out of house and home. And the children? What of them?

Knowing Jesus' sensitivity to people, it's easy to imagine Him escorting her home, seeing that no one would accost her on the way with further strident accusations and pointing of fingers. Though Jesus could reveal the hypocrisy of the mob that brought her to Him, she herself would have to carry the ignominy of the day's events in her heart. How truly wonderful if Jesus would have been able to touch her husband's heart, to release for that man the power of love and forgiveness with which the Holy Spirit that flooded the heart of Joseph!

And we? Is our sin that we constantly, somewhat hypocritically, bring people to Jesus that He might decide their innocence or guilt? Or that we do not forgive? Or that we do not take seriously what we, perhaps, take somewhat casually: **"FORGIVE US OUR SINS AS WE FORGIVE THE SINS OF OTHERS!"**

"Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her/him!"

He invites anyone among them who has never sinned to throw the first stone. Then he begins to write the men's sins in the dust.

One by one, the accusers drift away. Jesus despises the sin, but loves the sinner. He forgives her and sends her peacefully on her way.

Living the Word: Pray this prayer: "Lord, forgive me for the many times that I have condemned others. Help me to mind my own sins."

Every once in a while, I believe it is important to write a few words to you - St. Juliana parishioners.

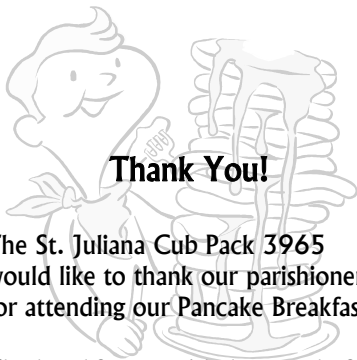
