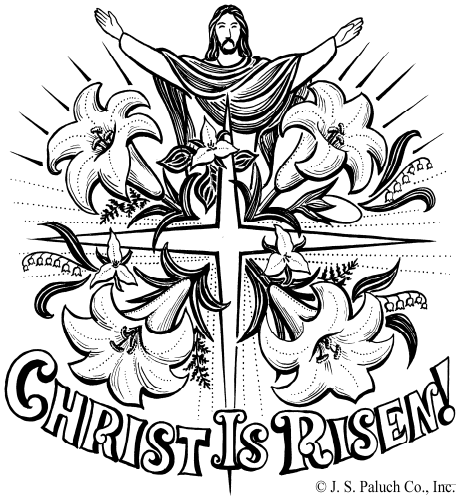

**"He Is Not Here..."**

**Remember what He Said to You ...  
And They Remembered"**

Sometimes we may think that Jesus knew quite clearly that He would rise from the dead; that He had all the details of His Life After Death in some hidden cache of Divine Knowledge, concealed somewhere in His human psyche. In a sense, He Did. We call it faith. Some may think it disrespectful to speak of Jesus' faith. But unless He had faith, a faith similar to ours, His death would not have been a truly human death, would it?

Due to the printing requirements of Paluch Printing Co. I find myself trying to center on the Easter Mysteries today, March 15th. The day has been hectic and nothing went the way I had planned it. Besides that, health issues within my family preoccupied me, so Easter was the farthest thing from my mind and heart.

But now that I sit here, a little after 7:00 pm, I find that the chaos of the day has mellowed into a reflective mood which brings with it a strange peace. Today, March 15th, is the 5th anniversary of my Mom's death. Her memory - her remembrance - has been with me throughout the day. "She is not here...remember what she said to you!"

It is also the death-anniversary and birthday of other members of my family who have died. Sometimes at moments like this, we are drawn into a sadness, even a depression from people very dear to us. Had Jesus not been raised by the Love of the Father through the Power of the Spirit, how would I deal with the deaths of my loved ones? I would truly be swallowed up in unassuaged mourning. I would think of them as lost to me and I to them.

"Death, where is your sting!?" So cries out St. Paul. He speaks from faith, a faith at once ratified and inspired by Love. In his hymn to Love, Paul's says: "These three remain: faith, hope and love; and the greatest of these is love." But what could love do, if there were no faith placed in it? In fact, to even experience love, one must trust in it, believe in it. Is faith not the human side of love? Is faith not the human side of **LOVE!**?

The author of the Letter to the Hebrews says: "Since therefore the children share in flesh and blood, He Himself likewise partook of the same nature, that through death He might destroy him who has the power of death, that is, the devil, and deliver all those who through fear of death were subject to lifelong bondage. For surely it is not with angels that He is concerned but with the descendants of Abraham. Therefore, He has to be made like His brothers and sisters in every respect, so that He might become a merciful and FAITHFUL high priest in the service of God, to make expiation for the sins of the people. "FOR BECAUSE HE HIMSELF HAS SUFFERED AND BEEN TEMPTED, HE IS ABLE TO HELP THOSE WHO ARE TEMPTED."

Hang in there, brothers and sisters, knowing that your FAITH-LOVE is God's gift to you, and yours to God. Jesus knows what it's like living a life like yours!

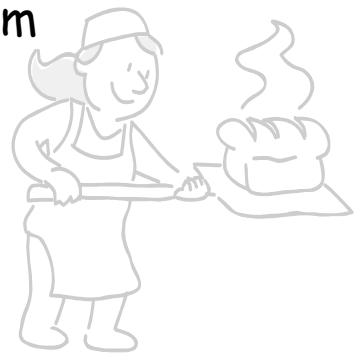

## Parish Pastoral Council Meeting - March Minutes

This month the Parish Council met on Monday, March 19<sup>th</sup> at 7:30 pm in the parish dining room. In attendance were Diane Damert, Julie Longo, Sharon Brabson, Francis Corrigan, Fr. Steve, Margie Shiel, Peter Ruddy, Jim Walsh, Mary Gehrling, Diane Holmen, Walter Powers, Lisa Philbrick, Sara Murphy and Bruce Burud. The meeting always starts with Faith sharing, and this month Sharon related a wonderful story she heard at Parish Leadership Day about an African tribe, its king and a servant with two water pots. The servant brought water to his king everyday with these pots. One pot was good, the other cracked. The servant learned that the cracked pot, although seemingly useless was actually very useful in its own way. The water that fell from it had fed the ground and there were flowers all over the hillside where the servant had walked. The moral: we should be thankful for whatever gifts we have – we are all useful. A brief discussion followed about where each of us gets our glimpses of God in our life – everywhere within us, around us.

Moving on to business, we had the Pastor’s report from Fr. Steve. The Council was updated on the progress of the Annual Catholic Appeal – St. Juliana is still doing well with hopes to surpass last year’s collection, although we will still fall short of the Archdiocese’s goal of \$62,000. Separately, Fr. Steve reported that next year’s budget was approved by the Finance Council and has now been sent downtown for the Archdiocese’s approval. Parish Projects will come to the forefront soon. The first priorities on the list are roofing, masonry and electrical wiring.

The School report was also given by Fr. Steve this month. He related that the program “Easing the Teasing”, through workshops and plays, was targeting bullying in school. First Reconciliation was noted to be set for 3/20, while the school’s production of “Music Man” was set for 3/26 and 3/27 at 7:00pm. Fr. Steve also noted that he and Mrs. Barton planned on having a meeting with any parents that have questions on budget, tuition or registration fees.

The Council then moved on to discuss formulating its Long-Term Goals. A few goals were suggested, then each member was instructed to think about other goals that could be included, along with tasks pertaining to them. These ideas will be shared at the next Council meeting.

The Council then discussed the May Commission meeting. The idea that the Council members would each attend meetings of organizations within their Commissions was suggested. This would take the place of a traditional-style Commission meeting. This idea will be further developed with discussions at the April council meeting.

With the Parish Birthday Party coming up fast, the Council then discussed volunteering as a group. A sign-up sheet was passed around and further information as to which tasks the Council will be assigned will be discussed as the date (Sunday, June 3<sup>rd</sup>) gets closer.

Finally, the April meeting agenda was set and we prayed for an ill parishioner. With that, the meeting was adjourned at 9:13pm. The next Parish Council meeting will be Monday, April 16<sup>th</sup> at 7:30pm in the Parish Center.

### RETIREMENT FUND FOR RELIGIOUS

Dear Pastor, Parish Staff and Parishioners,

The continuing generosity of all of you to the Retirement Fund for Religious collection in December is very deeply appreciated. This year, as of January 31<sup>st</sup>, the fund has received \$1,040,000 from \*276 parishes. This is a major tribute of gratitude to those religious who have served this archdiocese over the years! Ninety-five cents of every dollar donated goes directly to those in need.

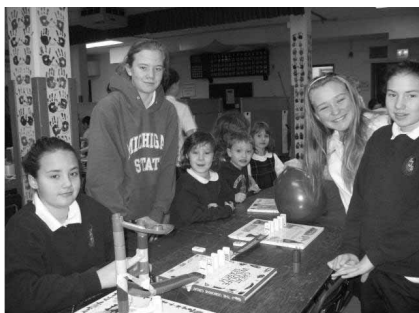
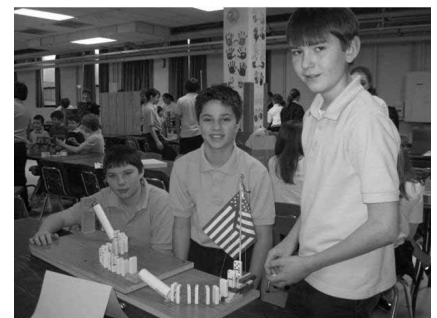
## St. Juliana Students Celebrate 100 Day!
