“Jesus Said to Simon Peter, ‘ Simon, Son of John, Do You Love Me More Than These?’”

And Jesus looked at the Catholic-Christian and said: “You, my Catholic-Christian brothers and sisters, do you love me more than the Protestants, Hindus, Muslims, Jains, Taoists, and Atheists do?”

Or, Jesus might be asked: “Jesus, Son of God, do you love us more than these?!”

More than...less than. These do not enter God’s Divine Vocabulary. There is only one in God’s love vocabulary. God looks at all peoples and says His Word of Love. And so that all humans might understand it, God speaks in human-Divine terms...JESUS CHRIST.

Sometimes we may think that being Catholic-Christians gives us some sort of “advantage” when it comes to our relationship with God. As if somehow we have an insurance policy or some sort of special access to God. The disciples of Jesus early in His public life had a notion like that. They thought of themselves as the “inner circle” which had a hint of exclusiveness to it. I suppose that people who wanted some favor from Jesus would, often enough, contact one or other of the disciples to “put in a good word” for them.

Jesus, on the other hand, seems to be “free-wheeling” in His benefactions, making Himself available to Samaritans, Romans, Greeks, children, women, cripples, tax collectors, members of the Sanhedrin, the ritually unclean, the poor, the rich, the good guys and the bad guys. This obviously disconcerted the disciples in the beginning. Remember the time Jesus asked them what they were discussing on the way. They sheepishly admitted that they had been arguing about “who was the greatest among them.”

Is this not always a temptation for us as well?

When Jesus asked Peter: “Do you love me more than these?”, He must have had a sly, Divine, smile on His face. Peter understood and simply said, “You know I love you, Lord.” It was, perhaps at this very moment that Peter understood the universality of God’s Love for all peoples of the world; it was, perhaps, at the very moment that Peter understood Jesus, God’s Love in Human Form. And, it was, perhaps, at this very moment that Peter became aware of his own call to be the living, enfolded Love of God in the world.

“AS THE FATHER SENT ME, SO I SEND YOU. RECEIVE THE HOLY SPIRIT!”

The Good News of St. John ends with this prophetic vision: “Now, there are many other things that Jesus did. If they were all written down one by one, I suppose that the whole world could not hold the books that would be written.”

Are we still writing those “Jesus-books”? They all begin and end with the Jesus-question: “Do you love me?”

Jesus came setting no conditions to His Father’s Love. It took His disciples quite a while to accept the Reality of that. Once they did, they became “apostles,” people with Good News for the whole world.

Tax Rules for Parish Contributions

Due to recent changes in tax laws, beginning with contributions made in 2007, parishioners (those who itemize their tax returns) will no longer be able to deduct contributions to the parish unless they maintain a bank record or written contribution statement from the parish. The parish can only track contributions made using parish envelopes, and will produce a written statement of those contributions at the end of each tax year. The best way to ensure the deductibility of your contributions to the parish is to always use your parish envelopes. Cancelled checks and other bank records are also sufficient documentation, but the only way cash contributions can be properly tracked and reported is if they're enclosed in a personalized parish envelope.

Not only can they describe the parts of the violin, they can recognize the violin in a musical setting! AND they can name the piece of music that they are listening to. We have studied Antonio Vivaldi's "Spring" from his "Four Seasons", Samuel Barber's "Adagio for Strings", Papa Haydn's "Surprise Symphony", "Flight of the Bumble Bee" by Rimsy-Korasakov, and Smetana's "Dance of the Comedians" (Road Runner) by Smetana. Now how cool is that!!!!!!

The 4th graders are working very hard learning how to play their recorders. I am happy to announce we have very few squeaks, bleeps and incorrect pitches!!! We met our goal--to play a simple little tune during a Lenten prayer service. Our music helped create a reverence felt by us all.

The Lenten prayer services in the gym have become exceptional! Our 4th grade Youth Choir members led songs professionally and with strength. The classes filled the gym with their beautiful singing! The Eighth graders from Music Enrichment played Orff instruments during the Monday morning Prayer Service! They were examples of fine musicianship, prayerful attitudes and showed their ability to adapt to unforeseen requests! We are very proud of them!
