“The Father and I Are One”

I was at the recently remodeled restaurant on the corner of Caldwell and Touhy with some friends the other day. This couple have been friends of mine since my days at Our Lady of the Brook in Northbrook. When we get together, our sharings run the gamut from catching up on personal news to theologizing about ourselves, the events in our lives, and the situations in various parts of the world. The word “theologizing” may sound pretty impressive, but actually, it’s just the way we have related with each other for years - it’s effortless, but often not painless.

Well, this time, we shared table-fellowship and allowed our hearts and minds to roam freely over the details of our lives, the lives of our respective parishes, and the lives of humans in general, the subject of death came up. Don’t ask me how. It was just there and we did not avoid it.

In a society like ours which puts such emphasis on “quality of life” and how to preserve one’s health, mobility, longevity, and happiness, it’s difficult to enter the real of “quality of death.” My friends, married for some 27 years, deeply in love, friends, soul mates, were, at first, a bit uncomfortable speaking of death - particularly each other’s death. “We want to die together!”

Many other people have expressed a similar desire. The prospect of living without the other is terrible to contemplate. But a new twist was added when my friend’s wife said: “If I die first, where will I be? What will that be like? I can’t imagine being somewhere without Jim.” When Jim heard that, he also expressed the same feelings: “I can’t imagine being somewhere without Peg.” What was interesting was that life-after-death was a kind of “limbo” for them, almost as if after death you kind of wander around in ghostly fashion, separated from loved ones and the familiar things of life. Remember Pirates of the Caribbean?

“Bind us together, Lord; bind us together, with ties that cannot be broken.” The lived mystery of love is the Lived Mystery of Love. We fear that after death, we will be left alone in this world, abandoned by our loved ones. Or we fear that we will be left alone in that “other world” separated from our loved ones. We do not appreciate the Mystery God enters into with us and we with God, when we love and are loved. It’s literally true; “What God has joined together, let no one put asunder!” Whether that joining together is in marriage/friendship or friendship.

In the Road to Daybreak, Henri Nouwen reflects: The Resurrection is not a spectacular event forcing people to believe. Rather, it was an event for the friends of Jesus, for those who had known Him, listened to Him, and believed in Him. It was a very intimate event: a world here, a gesture there, and a gradual awareness that something new was being born— small, hardly noticed, but with the potential to change the face of the earth. Mary of Magdala heard her name. John and Peter saw the empty grave. Jesus’ friends felt their hearts burn in encounters that find expression in the remarkable words ‘**HE IS RISEN.**’ All had remained the same, while all had changed.”

Why be any more afraid of dying than you are of loving?!

Parish Pastoral Council Meeting - April Minutes

The most recent Parish Council meeting was on Monday, April 16th at 7:30 pm in the parish dining room. In attendance were Diane Damert, Sharon Brabson, Francis Corrigan, Fr. Steve, Margie Shiel, Peter Ruddy, Jim Walsh, Mary Gehrling, Diane Holmen, Lisa Philbrick, Sara Murphy and Bruce Burud and Patti Weyna. The meeting kicked off with Faith sharing courtesy of Margie. She related how she spent her vacation time helping others in need. The theme was "service & time". She then encouraged the Council to relate their stories of how they took time to serve God and help others.

On the business side of things, the School Report was given by Patti who gave a recap of the major happenings with the school. She reported that both the final Battle of the Books battle and the Science Fair are scheduled for April 26th, while Confirmation will be May 3rd. Patti also gave a brief description of Religion Day (April 19th) and related some of the teachers' ideas for their classes.

Moving on, the Council continued its on-going "training" by sharing information that some members brought back from Parish Leadership Day this past February. The members that attended the seminar have so far shared inspirational learning through pointers and tips for Parish Councils. This night was Bruce's turn to share what he took away from "PLD". Among the things he learned were several helpful tips and advice for running an effective Parish Council. He then recapped the session he attended on social justice, including how to be an advocate for the poor and familiarizing oneself with social issues in order to be more effective.

The Council's Long-Term Goals were next on the table. Sharon gave a hand-out comprised of everyone's ideas for impending issues that face the Council. A full discussion ensued in which the members expanded on and prioritized the main goals.

Among the goals is to redefine the Council's relationship with the Commissions. The Council currently meets with the Church's organizations three times a year. The May Commission meeting will be cancelled for this year in light of the reorganization of ideas. However, the Council will still have Commission meetings next year with a mix of traditional gatherings hosted by the Council and those in which the Council members reciprocate by attending meetings of various groups.

The next big topic was Council membership. The discussion revolved around restating the current members' commitments to the Council and determining how many new members will be needed for the upcoming term (4-6, plus one staff member). In the first effort to gain new membership, Council members will speak at Mass to encourage interested parishioners to seek more info about being on the Council. It is important to note that the Council is an inclusive organization and is made up of regular parishioners. The pre-requisites are a love of Christ and His Church and a willingness to help St. Juliana to be its best.

Finally, the May meeting agenda was determined and the meeting closed with Margie's prayer from "Prayers for the Domestic Church". The meeting was adjourned at 9:10 pm. The next Parish Council meeting will be Monday, May 21st at 7:30pm in the Parish Center.

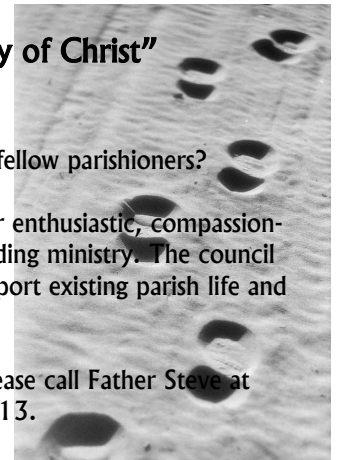
