“So What’s New About The New Commandments?!”

In today’s Good News, Jesus says: “I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.”

Rarely do we see a Cubs fan wearing a Sox cap or T-shirt or jacket. When we see someone with a Cubs cap on, we instinctively react: “Hey, hey! You’re a Cubs fan, huh?” Especially if that occurs on the Northside of Chicago. More rare, even a bit odd, would be someone wearing a Cubs cap or jacket who would deny any affiliation with the Cubs: “Hey, Man, not me! I’m a Sox fan!”

The same would hold true for a die-hard Sox fan, no?

Nowadays, we see a lot of T-shirts or caps or items bearing the logo: “I (image of red heart) St. Juliana School; or “I (image of red heart) the Cubs/ Sox.” The image of the big red heart stands for the word “love,” as everyone knows.

How about a decal: “I (image of red heart) to love”? Or maybe: “I (image of red heart) Love”?

We have grown up thinking that “love” is something you give to especially dear people, people who are close to you, people who evoke that kind of response from you by the way they relate to you. We use a much less powerful word, “like,” for the general run of people to whom we must be “nice.”

When Jesus says He is giving us a “New Commandment,” He is not giving us some divine imperative which is totally unique to His followers. And that’s the beauty of it. Jesus did not “invent” a new way of relating to each other. From the beginning of human-time, people always know how to love. They didn’t have to learn how to love. In a sense, they had to learn **WHOM** to love.

We are recognized as the followers of Jesus not by the fact that we love one another, but that the “one another” includes all the people of the world, past, present, and to come. Jesus said that the love which will identify His followers would cut through ethnic, religious, political, linguistic, and social boundaries. It’s not the loving that identifies the follower of Christ; it’s the universality of the loving.

It’s as if Jesus is saying: “It’s really not a new commandment that I’m giving you. All peoples are created in the image of my Father. All peoples love; it’s part of being called into existence. What’s new is that you must use the Divine Love-power for absolutely everyone. You must be like God to all people!”

We must live our loyalty, as proudly and tenaciously as we live our sports, school, political, social loyalties.

I (IMAGE OF BIG RED HEART) EVERYONE! GO JESUS!”

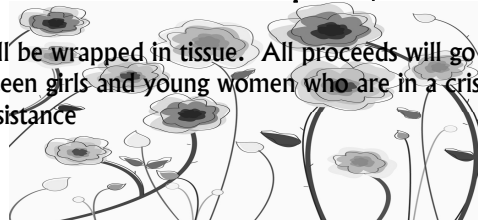

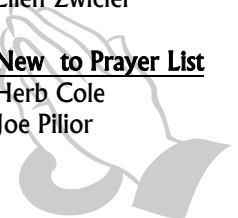

Dear Friends in Christ,

On Mother's Day, we gratefully celebrate the gifts of love that each of us has received from the woman who gave us life. For thousands of mothers throughout Cook and Lake counties, Mother's Day will be happier this year because of the life-giving work of Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Chicago.

Most of these mothers were homeless or living on very low incomes. Their children are now happy, well-fed and clothed, and housed safely because Catholic Charities provided affordable apartments, employment opportunities and supportive programs for their families that enabled them to achieve a life of stability, self-sufficiency and human dignity.

In 1917, Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Chicago was founded to care for the overwhelming number of poor families whom individual parishes could no longer assist.
