"I Received From The Lord What I Also Handed On To You"

Very often at wedding liturgies, when I come to the words of consecration, that very dramatic and holy moment when we recall that Jesus gave His Body and Blood for the world, it flashes through my mind and heart that this couple, this husband and wife are saying the very same words to each other.

THIS IS MY BODY THAT IS FOR YOU...THIS CUP IS THE NEW COVENANT IN MY BLOOD."

What a powerful, truly romantic, declaration of love, of self-gift!

Sometimes we struggle, even perhaps anguish, trying to have some experience of God's love for us. At times, it may seem far beyond us, in some Divine realm into which access is limited. We may even think that only a select few are called into the depths of that Mystery. We might say: "Oh, if only I were holy enough to be related to God like the saints!"

The Sacramental system instituted by Jesus is not something beyond our understanding. However, you could argue that love is not something or someone you "understand." Love is shown in deeds and love is "understood" in deeds. If love is not "sacramentalized," i.e. put into signs, it would be difficult, if not impossible, for us humans to experience it.

Now what I'm wondering, is whether God uses our very humanity and its manifold experiences to reveal Him/Herself. That is to say, our humanity is one, great big **SACREMENT!** God uses the most profound experiences of our lives to reveal Love: birth, adolescence, consecration of one's life, creativity, sickness, death. In time, these events were chosen to represent the total **SACRAMENT** of our lives. In Jesus Christ, the Mystery of being human-Divine is revealed, and it is ours!

A man and woman give themselves to each other - "This is my body...This is my blood" - and life becomes. Jesus, aware of the profundity of human love because it has been put into humans by the Father, makes His ultimate gift of Love in terms we humans can appreciate: "This is Me; take me into yourselves and live as my Father, and I live by the power of the Spirit." So very much like sacramental marriage, is it not?

Receiving the Body and Blood of Christ is not some "magic" from outside our human lives and experience. It is the sacrament from which we all come into being. It is the sacrament from which the whole Church comes into being.

Oh, Jesus: "THIS IS MY BODY; THIS IS MY BLOOD!"

Would Psalm 8 help?

"Oh Lord, When I look at the sky, which you have made,
At the moon and the stars, which you set in their place—
What are human beings, that you think of them,
Mere mortals, that you care for them?
Yet you made them inferior only to yourself;
You crowned them with glory and honor."

Wow!


