“The Lord on His Part Has Forgiven Your Sin; You Shall Not Die”

...Usually when I begin to reflect on the Sunday readings, either for my homily or my article for the bulletin, I begin by reading the first reading and then read the Gospel. In the ordinary time of the year, the theme can be found in the first and third readings from the Eucharist.

Following my usual procedure, I read the story from 2 Samuel about Nathan who was sent to David to “read him the riot act!” David was attracted to Uriah’s wife. In the passion of his desire for her, David plotted to send Uriah into the front lines so that he would get mowed down by the enemy. Then David would be free to add Uriah’s wife to his harem. Nathan got wind of David’s plot and subsequent death of Uriah. He says: “Now, therefore, the sword shall never depart from your house, because you have despised me (God) and have taken the wife of Uriah to be your wife.”

“Sock it to ‘em, Lord! Teach that son-of-a-gun that he can’t get away with that, just because he’s king!”

David says: “I have sinned against the Lord.” Nathan says: “The Lord on His part has forgiven your sin; you shall not die.”

Now waitaminut! The Gospel is about the sinful woman who comes into the home of Simon the Pharisee. Her devotion evokes a forgiving response from Jesus. Now when I read those two readings, I did not feel at peace. Through Nathan, God tells David that he has been forgiven and that David will not be punished with death.

Ordinarily, the first and Gospel readings emphasize a theme which is easily discernible, but, for some reason, I didn’t like the fact that David seemed to get off so easily...especially in the light of the machinations David went through to have Uriah killed. That God would simply tell David through the prophet: “Your sin has been forgiven; you shall not die” did not seem to satisfy some show of repentance on the part of David. In the Gospel, the woman’s repentance and love is obvious. She comes into a situation which took great courage and humility.

There’s gotta be something more to the David story, I said to myself. Sure enough. In verses not quoted in today’s reading, Nathan, speaking of God, says: “Now in every generation some of your descendants will die a violent death because you have disobeyed me and have taken Uriah’s wife. I swear to you that I will cause someone from your own family to bring trouble on you...and because you have shown such contempt for the Lord in doing this, your child will die.

Our parental sensitivities cry out: **PUNISH ME BUT NOT MY CHILDREN!** And yet, in some way, are not our sins visited on our children, on future generations? Do we consider this when we speak of ecological evils being visited on our planet, when we see racial prejudice continuing to poison the minds and hearts of our young people, when we see centuries - old animosities still reaping the bitter fruit of hatred and ill-will, when our own selfish behavior as parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, priests, religious, neighbors, classmates, continues to fill the spiritual lungs and brains of our children.

Lord, allow us to pay the price of our sins. Please, please, do not punish our children and future generations. Give us the grace to repent.

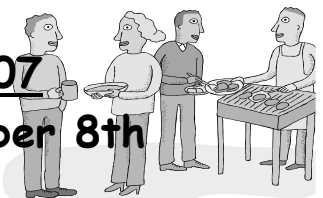
