"Mission Impossible"

A couple of days ago, I was flipping channels and came across Richard Attenborough's classic film Gandhi. It was Sunday afternoon and I did have intentions of "getting out" for some R&R. But, obviously, the film and Ben Kingsley's dramatic portrayal of Gandhi-ji brought back poignant memories of India. Many of the scenes in the film were shot in areas of the State of Bihar where I had my roots.

The three hours of the film moved, through the medium of vignettes, to its denouncement in the totally senseless assassination of Gandhi-ji, at a time when his presence could have done much to unite Hindus and Muslims and Sikhs and Christians in India.

Gandhi-ji was a dreamer, a man of deep spiritual insight. He believed that non-violence was the spiritual path to follow in the issue of securing India's independence from the British Empire. It was not a popular position to advocate, and the film brings out effectively the various groups, all wanting the same thing but in such diverse - often contradictory—ways.

"Eye for an eye" seemed so much more logical and efficient: i.e. the end justifies any and all means! "Turn the other cheek" seemed so unfruitful in a culture that had been ruled for over 200 years by a foreign power. There were no more "cheeks" to be turned and those who advocated a violent uprising were certainly more attractive to many people.

Every breakdown in SATYAGRAH (the "Peace movement") of AHINSA ("non-violence") led to Gandhi-ji initiating long fasts which would eventually lead leaders of all parties to ask him to break his fast. Such was his moral power among the masses. One of his closest friends was Rev. C.J. Andrews, an Anglican pastor who sided with Gandhi-ji until Bapu himself asked him to leave the matter of independence to the Indians themselves. But the bond of friendship remained strong, supportive.

Gandhi-ji was especially influenced in his personal spirituality by Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. For Gandhi-ji this summarized all that he himself was trying to instill in his "freedom fighters." It was, preeminently the **WAY OF AHINSA, THE WAY OF SATYAGRAH.**

As I watched the film - "experienced it" would be a better word - I was struck by Gandhi-ji's ardor and refusal to "do it the world's way." Someone else I know was like that too: "Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along and way. In whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household.'"

And then there's that "turn-the-other-cheek" business!

Tax Rules
for Parish Contributions

Due to recent changes in tax laws, beginning with contributions made in 2007, parishioners (those who itemize their tax returns) will no longer be able to deduct contributions to the parish unless they maintain a bank record or written contribution statement from the parish. The parish can only track contributions made using parish envelopes, and will produce a written statement of those contributions at the end of each tax year. The best way to ensure the deductibility of your contributions to the parish is to always use your parish envelopes. Cancelled checks (the preferred method of payment) and other bank records are also sufficient documentation, but the only way cash contributions can be properly tracked and reported is if they're enclosed in a personalized parish envelope.
