"Survivor.....Lost"

We're somewhat familiar with the TV programs which pit people against people to test their ingenuity and endurance. The contestants are reduced to the bare essentials for survival. It's interesting that in our culture which tends to pride itself on possessions, having all the things necessary for the "good life," we should be intrigued by programs which depict human beings struggling with a minimum of resources and gadgets.

The question can be posed in different ways. It could be: "How many conveniences (material, psychological, dietary, etc.) can you live without?" Or it might be: "How many conveniences (material, psychological, dietary, etc.) do you need in order to live in a humanly satisfying way?"

The author of Ecclesiastes is the ultimate "party pooper," no? "Vanity of vanities...All things are vanity."

HONEST AND SIMPLE PERSON: "how about eating a good meal?"

QOHELETH (the commentator of Ecclesiastes): "That's vanity!"

HSP: "How about living in a nice neighborhood?"

QO: "That's vanity!"

HSP: "How about sending my kids to college?"

QO: "That's vanity!"

Now waitaminit! What's this "vanity, vanity" business!?"

I suppose that Ecclesiastes and the Gospel of Luke are inviting us to reflect on our PRIORITIES. Priorities are prior to, "ahead of" something else, no? "This is in the front, and this is in the back." We speak of "putting something on the back burner, "do we not? The very fact that we live in time necessitates a temporal prioritization: "this comes before that, and that comes after this."

Everything in our lives cannot possibly be of equal value. All things and circumstances cannot call forth from us an equal response of energy, involvement, time...love. That would be physically and psychologically impossible and would lead to a basic frustration with our lives.

It's necessary from time to time to reevaluate the priorities in our lives. It's all too easy to fall prey to images, icons, advertising, adolescent dreams, peer pressure, etc. After a time, we find that we no longer belong to ourselves. We "buy into" the system, the good life. "Quality of life" takes on a meaning determined by forces outside of ourselves. We begin, all too imperceptibly, to "toe the line," and "march to someone else's drum."

What are the "vanities" of my life? Those circumstances which are vacuous, lacking in genuine intelligence, thought, or real spirituality. What is vain is characterized by lack of purpose.

Oh, did I mention? In order to get a sense of the personal "vanities" of our lives, we must revel in discernment. St. Ignatius of Loyola said:

"I call it consolation (the movement of the Good Spirit) when an interior movement is aroused in the soul, by which it is inflamed with love of its Creator and Lord, and as a consequence, can love no creature on the face of the earth for its own sake, but only in the Creator of them all." (Spiritual Exercises, no. 316)

This ministry would involve an evening of training and then a commitment to one of the weekend Masses about once a month.

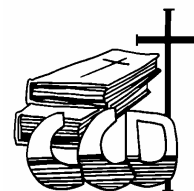

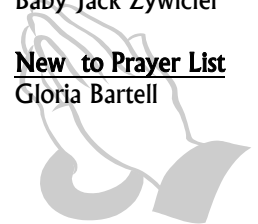

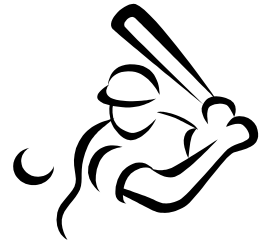
