Stanley Kostka: 1550 - 1568

November 13th is the feast of Stanley Kostka, Jesuit novice. It's also the birthday of my cousin Stanley Michalec.

The Kostka boy was of noble stock, born in Rostkow in Poland. At the age of 14, he was sent to study at the Jesuit College in Vienna. It was there that " he got his vocation," as we used to say years ago. It was a strange kind of terminology in those days, usually used for religious vocations: "He got his vocation."

We have heard quite a bit about "Jesuits and young boys" of late, haven't we? All kinds of terrible images come to mind when we think of youngsters in hostels, separated from their families. But, even in the midst of current publicity, people like Stanley Kostka and the Jesuits who inspired him in Vienna and afterwards are equally real and no less powerful for us moderns.

St. Peter Canisius, S.J. and St. Francis Borgia, SJ. (whose own kin, the infamous "Borgias" of Church history, evoke images of licentiousness in the clergy!) all played a role in Stanley's discernment process. I'm sure Stanley did not live in a world of saints, unaware of the evil humans could perpetrate on each other. Imagine, if you will, a teenager of that era, far from home and family, on a somewhat quixotic quest to fulfill his desire to enter religious life - and not just any religious life, but one which had already refused his access in his home environs. Here he is, traipsing around Europe in pursuit of what he experiences as "his call."

You know, the story of Stanley is even stranger, because his vocation was to be in pursuit of his vocation! When he had attained it, he died! He was a Jesuit for only a year—a Jesuit novice, to be precise. In the letter of recommendation Peter Canisius wrote to the Jesuit superiors in Rome, he said: "**We Hope For Great Things From Him.**" Stanley had just about left the starting block for the race St. Paul refers to as his own life's run, and he died. He died a mere novice remarkable for his mature sanctity.

Hey, you 8th graders! Hey, you guys in high school! What are you running towards? What kind of a life are you willing to sacrifice for? Are you being "carried along," or have you already begun to hear the Voice - "**Da Voice!**" Or maybe you're too afraid to listen too closely for what you might hear.

Whenever the Feast of the St. Stanley comes, I feel so embarrassed. After all, I am a 67 year old and have yet to attain to his enthusiasm for being a Jesuit. Ah, but hope springs eternal, doesn't it?

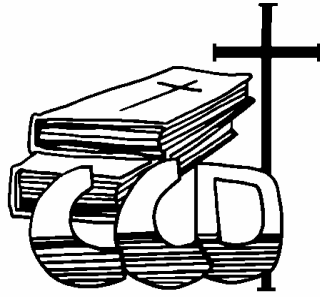
### THIRD YEAR:

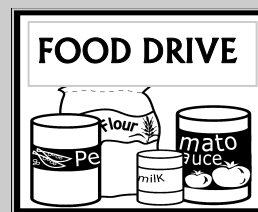

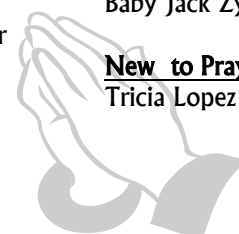

### Charitable IRA Rollover

A new law makes it possible, if you are age 70 1/2 or older, to transfer up to \$100,000 a year from your IRA to qualified charities without incurring income tax on the withdrawal. The provision is effective for the remainder of the 2007 tax year only, so you must act by December 31 to take advantage.

**Some highlights:**

- The amount transferred to the parish from an IRA does not increase the donor's adjusted gross income on their tax return.
- Those who do not itemize their deductions (and therefore can't claim charitable deductions) still receive the benefit of not triggering a taxable IRA distribution.
- These IRA charitable rollovers will count toward a donor's mandatory annual distribution. In other words, instead of taking a mandatory IRA distribution you don't need, you can instruct your IRA trustee to send those funds to St. Juliana Parish instead.
- The ceilings on the percentage of adjusted gross income that you can claim as a charitable deduction do not apply to these special IRA transfers.
