Mountains Out of Molehills

Isaiah writes: "The mountain of the Lord's house shall be established as the highest mountain and raised above the hills. All nations shall stream toward it: many peoples shall come and say: 'Come, let us climb the Lord's mountain, to the house of the God of Jacob.' "

In 1966 I saw Mount Everest with the naked eye - an awe and prayer-inspiring event for this fellow from the near south side of Chicago! Oh, it was some distance away. Some Jesuit companions and I, an international conglomeration of youthful spirits and energy, had traveled to Calcutta from where we trekked to a minor hill station. If I remember correctly, it was called Sundukphu, or such sounding name.

We were an assortment of travelers: an American, two Australians, a South Indian or two, a Belgique (French speaking), a Fleming, an Indian tribal, and, in the midst of this motley band of Jesuits, a lone diocesan priest from Ireland.

When I prayed and reflected over today's first reading and its reference to "the mountain of the Lord's house" higher than all the rest, I had images and memories of that Everest experience 40 years ago. All of us had one aim: to get a glimpse of Everest from Sundukphu. Even though we were young and vigorous, the climb up from the plains was, at times, challenging. Though we had known each other only a very short while and came from different cultures, it did not take long before we were wise cracking and sharing life-stories.

As we climbed higher, it was as if the encumbrances of our diverse languages and customs fell away, like the excess portage of mountain climbers who go up and up with less and less to hinder the climb.

Oh, we were not climbing as in the photos or films you might see, hanging onto ropes, blown away by the high winds, etc. But it was a climb of some considerable challenge. What did keep with us was our good humor, the spirit of sharing the food we had in our packs, and the ready hand or support as we each traversed the narrow paths and tortuous ascents.

When we arrived a the top of Sundukphu, clouds had spread a thick blanket over us and nothing could be seen. We were saddened at the prospect of not seeing Everest. But around 4:30 am a cry was heard. It was Boniface Kujur shouting: "Fellas! C'mon out! Look! Look!" And there, with the sun shinning on her snowy, majestic head was Everest. We sang; we danced; we hugged each other. But then we fell silent for a long, long, long time.

The Mountain of the Lord's House! We had made the journey together. There's no fun in doing it any other way.






