Presentation of the Lord

In the past, this feast on February 2nd was referred to as the Feast of the Purification. I may have written of my recollections from childhood, when I would see young women come into our parish church after Mass and go over to the Blessed Mother's altar. The priest would come out in cassock and surplice and bless the women - usually there was only one at any given time - and pray over them. As I recall, they used to refer to this as "churching." It was a minor celebration of the woman's return to the parish after child birth.

In India, the custom was still prevalent. It was thought that childbirth somehow made a woman "unclean."

That sounds terrible today, doesn't it? The Church recognized that and shifted the emphasis to where it belongs, namely, the Holy Family's presentation of Jesus in the temple in order to fulfill all the prescriptions of the Law for themselves.

The author of the Letter to the Hebrews puts it very beautifully: "Since the children, as He calls them, are people of flesh and blood, Jesus Himself became like them and shared their human nature. He did this so that through His death He might destroy the Devil...This means that He had to become like His people in every way...And now He can help those who are tempted, because He Himself was tempted and suffered."

In Jesus, God became like us every way. In the Presentation in this Temple, in Jesus we were offered to God, the Source and Origin of our being. The Father looked upon Jesus, Joseph and Mary and saw all of us! In a sense, we were all present on the occasion of that Mystery of the life of Christ, because Christ's life, at that moment, was pre-eminently ours, and our lives were pre-eminently His. The Incarnation was the Divine - seed being planted in our humanity and our human seed being irrevocably planted in God.

In the Incarnation, the Devil died! He would henceforth be reduced to the role of "tempter." Like a de-fanged venomous snake, he could twist and hiss and entwine himself around the feet of humans, but he was powerless to do them death. The Incarnation had struck the Devil's death-knell. All that is left to him is the death of humans, which now, because of Jesus, hold no terror. It no longer holds the quality or condition of being final, settled, or complete. In the Incarnation, death has lost its conclusiveness.

Our Baptism is not a promise. It is a fulfillment that the Incarnation is real, both ours and that of Jesus. "Oh death, where is your sting!?"

2008 LENTEN REGULATIONS



- 1. Abstinence from meat is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and ALL Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years old and older.
2. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age, but not yet 59. Those who are bound to this may take only one full meal. Eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. But if necessary, two smaller meals are permitted in order to maintain strength according to individual needs.

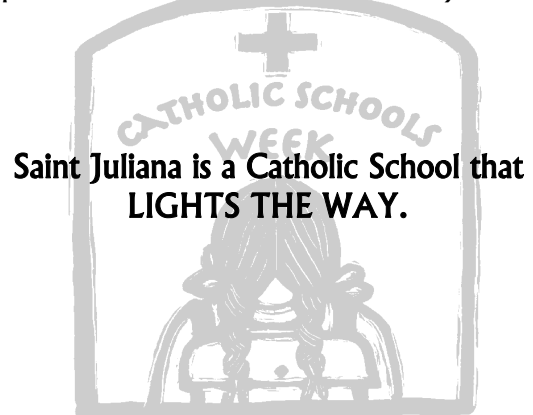

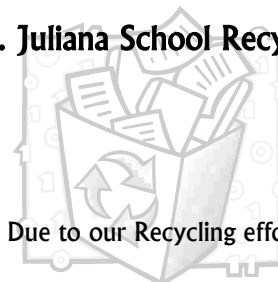
St. Juliana School Science Fair

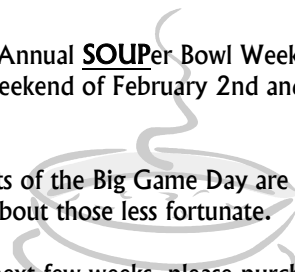

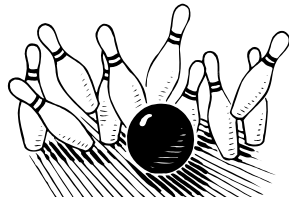

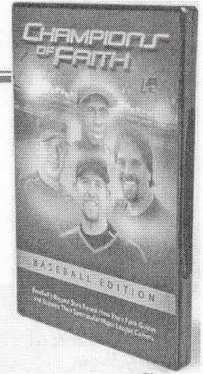
