

The Palm of Martyrdom

In the Book of Revelations, there is this vision: "After this I looked, and there was an enormous crowd no one could count all the people! They were from every race, tribe, nation, and language, and they stood in front of the throne and the Lamb, dressed in white robes holding palm branches in their hands."

The date-palm-different than what we see and use on Palm Sunday - grows in a single trunk without branches and sometimes reaches a height of 100ft. At the top it flowers into a coronet of fronds 6 feet long, beneath which the dates hang in clusters. It's common to Egypt and Palestine. On the basis of that text from the Book of Revelation, the palm has become the symbol of the martyr, most probably because people used them—for lack of flags or banners—to welcome Jesus to Jerusalem as He made His way to His suffering and death.

As Lent draws to its inevitable conclusion with the entrance into Jerusalem of Jesus, His arrest, mock trial, condemnation and ultimate Roman style death on the cross, Palm Sunday can be the beginning of a period of sadness and mourning and heaviness. As children, it ushered in for us a period of more intense "giving up" of favorite activities, TV, snacks. It is signified that we were on the threshold of Holy Week - (can some of you recall the theme song to that TV series, Dagnet!?)

Being adults we have an advantage over the youngsters. We lived through innumerable Holy Weeks and Palm Sundays. We have, hopefully, come to realize that what Jesus is going through, is nothing but human life at its most helpless and tragic. We are reminded by Palm Sunday and its aftermath that our own lives have the same movement toward death with its seeming darkness and inevitability.

As adults we have experienced - perhaps are experiencing - the doubt and frustration in the face of the death, or the dying, of a loved one. With Mary we cry out: "O God, where are you?! Is this what life is intended for. Answer me!?" What parent at the bedside of a terminally ill adult-child has not wondered where the love of God is, and why God does not feel what the parent feels? Or what child watching a much-loved Mom or Dad suffer through the remainder of life has not been willing to share the sufferings, the fears, the doubts that their parent is suffering? Friends, not just seeing friends die, but, in some sense, "dying" with them - they understand Holy Week.... From the inside. The **Palm of Martyrdom** is as much the symbol of the loving as it is of the dying.

As Revelations puts it: "These are the people who have come safely through the terrible persecution...Never again will they hunger or thirst; neither sun nor any scorching heat will burn them, because the Lamb, Who is in the center of the throne, will be their shepherd, and He will guide them to springs of life-giving water. And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

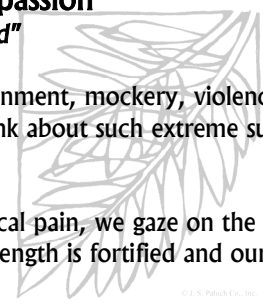

Pastoral Council Mission Statement

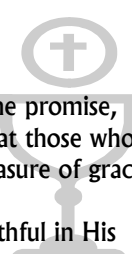
The St. Juliana Parish Pastoral Council is an enthusiastic, compassionate, faith-filled community participating in the ministry of the Church.

Kindergarten & Preschool News:

Saint Juliana School is hosting a **3 and 4 year-old Preschool Open House** on Friday, March 14, from 8:30 until 10:30 A.M. and on Wednesday, April 16 from 8:30 until 10:30 A.M. This is an opportunity for parents to observe the preschool classes while in session. More information about the program will be available on those days.

Saint Juliana School will continue to offer a full-day and half-day Kindergarten program for the 2008/2009 school year. Enrollment numbers will determine whether the half-day students are in a self-contained classroom or included in a full-day classroom.

Our four-year-old Preschool Program offers classes five days a week from 8:15 until 10:45 A.M. Taking into consideration the demand for morning classes, we will offer two morning sessions. We will offer an afternoon program if there is sufficient enrollment.

Classes for three-year-olds are held on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 8:15 until 10:45 A.M. We will also offer a two-day morning program on Tuesday and Thursday if there is sufficient enrollment.

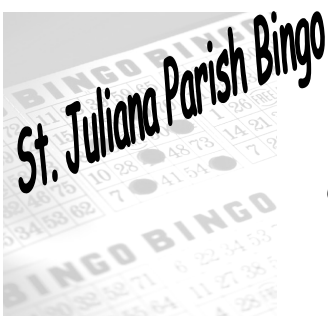
