July 13, 2008**

**You have crowned the year with your bounty,
and your paths overflow with a rich harvest.**

— Psalm 65:12



“ The Word Of The Lord!”
“Thanks Be to God!”

“God’s word acts now, embedding itself in our history, creating, covenanting, forgiving, empowering. That’s why proclaiming the Scriptures at Liturgy is more than reading - **IT’S AN EVENT IN WHICH GOD ACTS.**”

This is the way Bernadette Gasslein speaks of God’s living word; Living Word! I like that description of reading the Scripture in the Liturgy as “an event in which God acts.” Why not extend the power of that statement to our own private reading of the Scriptures in our homes or offices or schools, or on the bus or train, or listening to a tape or CD or the Scriptures read by a person with wonderful diction and meaningful pacing?

If, truly, proclaiming and listening to the Word of God is an “event in which God acts,” then it must be faith speaking to faith. It must be proclaimed with conscious love so that the Conscious Love acting in the words might be afforded the best possible medium of expression. Remember: the medium is the message.

When the Scriptures are proclaimed in Liturgical actions, devotions, or personal reading, we are the message. It is not that we listen to the Word and then go out somewhere to perform it, to “live it out,” as it were. Ms. Gasslein’s insight is that God acts in the very proclamation of the Word of Scripture.

Maybe I’ve shared this particular point with you before in some reflection or other. Years ago, Latin terminology was used to describe certain theological truths because it was felt that the language lent itself to clarity and conciseness of expression. Whatever! There was a phrase used for the actions

of the Sacraments: **EX OPERE OPERATO** (“By the very performing of the act”). It was thought that the Sacraments were the very actions of God Him/Herself and their effect could not be lessened by the unworthiness of the minister, the priest. Wow! God thought of everything. Nothing, no one, was going to get in the way of God’s Love!

What Ms. Gasslein is inviting us to reflect on and believe in is that the Scriptures proclaimed in the Liturgy are truly an event in which God acts. After prayer and reflection, I’m putting my own “two cents” into the mix by suggesting that that event of God acting is something like ex opera operato. So that, even when we privately or in a non-liturgical group “proclaim” the Word, an event occurs, a Divine salvific action come to be in us and in the world.

If that’s true - and I believe it is - then with what reverence the Scriptures must be proclaimed! What a great responsibility is that of the readers at Mass. What a privilege for us all to study the Scriptures, listen to them, read them, ponder them, be taken into the event in which God acts in our own time and lives!

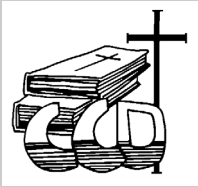

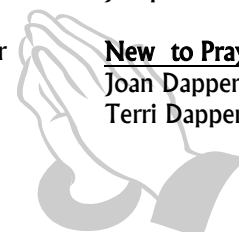
