“The Kingdom of God May Be Likened To...”

The feast of St. Bonaventure was on July 15th. He was a Franciscan Doctor of the Church. Now Doctors of the Church are usually proclaimed such because of their erudition and depth of insight into spirituality and theology and Scripture. Franciscans conjure up the image of their Founder, Francis of Assisi, living the simple life of a mendicant-ascetic, more at home in nature than the hallowed halls of philosophico-theological learning.

But Bonaventure was truly a Franciscan and a learned Doctor of the Church. In 1265 Pope Clement IV wished to name him archbishop of York, but Bonaventure respectfully refused the appointment. But in 1273, Pope Gregory X ordered him to accept the title of cardinal-bishop of Albano. It seems that when the papal legates came to present him with his red hat and other insignia of office, Bonaventure kept them waiting while he finished washing the dishes.

That may sound like a pious fable concocted by devotees of St. Bonaventure but he does seem to have been a person of great humility and simplicity, easily approachable by all strata of society - and especially the poor.

In a summary of his personal spirituality, Bonaventure observed: “The perfection of a religious man is to do common things in a perfect manner, and a constant fidelity in small matters is great and heroic virtue!” (Quoted by the famous philosopher Etienne Gilson in his The Philosophy of St. Bonaventure). Now isn't that consoling?! **TO DO COMMON THINGS IN A PERFECT MANNER.** Does that perhaps include shopping at Jewel, cutting the lawn, tending to the trees and flowers in our back yards, driving my car, greet-

ing the neighbors when I see them, saying “Hi!” to a kid who doesn't seem to be so popular in class, turning off the lights at home when I am not using them, changing into nice clothes when I go to Church, spending time with a sick relative, admiring the trees in front of my home, etc., etc., etc.,!?

For Bonaventure, delving into the Mysteries of theology or philosophy was no “big deal.” He didn't do that to gain prestige. He did it because that was “his thing”; that was the gift God had given him along with his simplicity and devotion to “Lady Poverty,” as St. Francis of Assisi used to lovingly refer to being poor. **A CONSTANT FIDELITY IN SMALL MATTERS IS A GREAT AND HEROIC VIRTUE.**

The examples that Jesus gives in the Good News are everyday situations or parables that evoke ordinary, small matters. When lived out consistently in the daily round of life's activities, they become heroic virtue - the “extraordinary ordinary” of what life is all about.

Thank God we are not asked to do uncommon things in a perfect manner!! God just says through Jesus: “Be the best that you can be!” When you stop and think about it, everyone's “best” is not the same, is it? Throw the ball as far as you can, dance as well as you can, sit on the recliner as comfortably as you can, tell that funny joke in the best way you can, frown the best way you can when you're embarrassed, scream well when you are frustrated, keep silent when you've said the best that you can, etc., etc., !

C'mon! It can't be that hard to be human!

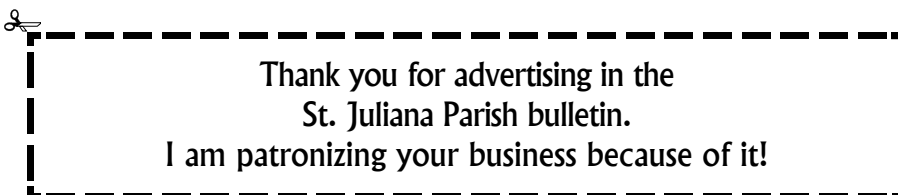
