St. John Vianney (1786 - 1859)

Sez John, the Cure of Ars (parish priest of Ars in France): "To be a saint one must be beside oneself, one must lose one's head."

John Vianney was pre-eminently a pastor. In the early days of his priestly studies, there was some doubt that he would be able to complete the course. In addition to his difficulties with studies, in the midst of his seminary life, he found himself "drafted" into the army and sent to Spain. On the way there, he deserted and went into hiding for several years. In 1810, there was a general amnesty and he was able to resume his formation.

He continued to have difficulties with studies but his sincerity and love of the priesthood persuaded superiors to approve him for ordination.

In 1817 Ars-en-Dombes would have been considered the "boondocks", a small parish of some 250 faithful. John's zeal and personal asceticism - it was said that the new Cure lived on nothing but potatoes and never seemed to sleep - soon won the hearts of his parishioners. Whenever he could, he would steal off to the church and spend long periods of time in silent adoration of the Eucharist.

What gradually dawned on his parishioners and began to work its gradual effect was the consciousness that their souls mattered to this holy priest and that he suffered for their sins.

John Vianney became famous for the long hours he spent in the confessional administering the Sacrament of Reconciliation to hundreds and hundreds of faithful. They came to him from the surrounding region. Today, we might wonder about this zeal for the Sacrament of Reconciliation, but John had a charism for bringing peace to tortured people and the conviction that God loved them with a deep and passionate love. He was giving Good News to the simple people of his time. But his fame spread to Napoleon III who presented the medal of the Legion of Honor to John. John's reaction: "I don't know what I have done to deserve this except to be a deserter."

John Vianney was canonized in 1925 by Pope Pius XI. At that same time, he was declared the patron saint of parish priests. In this day and age, we are concerned about the priesthood, about whether young people will be "attracted" to the life of a parish priest. We even try to emulate hi-tech advertising in presenting the priesthood. In the end, people like John Vianney, contrary to the expectations of his formators, are chosen by God to be living instruments of God's love and forgiveness for their parishioners.

Let us pray of parish priests that, like John Vianney, they may bring the solace of forgiveness to people.

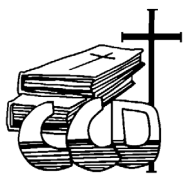

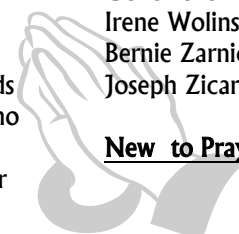
