"I Will Give You The Keys To The Kingdom Of Heaven"

I remember how humbled I was when my musician buddy, Eddie Ptaszek, told me where the keys to his home were kept, in case, I had to get my drums packed for a gig and he would not be home to open the doors for me. "Here, I'll show you where I keep the keys outside my basement."

No greater love hath a person than to give the keys of their home to you! Giving the keys to one's home is a wonderful act of intimacy and trust. To leave one's home vulnerable and available to a non-family member is, in effect, to treat that person as family.

It implies a confidence that the person to whom the keys are being given is trustworthy and conscientious. No homeowner does that casually, without a sense of the reliability of the person who's being given the privilege of having "the keys to the kingdom."

One does not lightly accept the responsibility of knowing where the keys are kept or the intricacies of how they are used to gain access to the home. It's not: "Oh yeah! Lemme know where you keep your house keys. I'll lock up after I leave!" Though there may not be a lot of "hemming and hawing," there is an instinctive sense of trusting and being trusted. To give someone access to one's home, the keys to the house, implies friendship of a special kind.

Imagine Jesus saying to you: "I'll give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven, my home, the place where I dwell and am most at rest!" They're not keys to some kind of office complex or business enterprise. One might more easily give keys to an office or storage area to a person one did not know too well. But to one's own home!?

My friend Eddie often tells me to relax, take something to eat, a cold drink, etc. "Mi case su casa!" Or, as we say in Hindi: "Apna ghar sumjheaa!" ("Take this as your home!") So it's not just the keys to open doors or cupboards in the basement. It's literally the "keys to Eddie Ptaszek's kingdom."

In another place Jesus said: "It is to you to know the secrets of the kingdom." **WOW!** Why would God give us this privilege? Why would He/She open all that He/She has to us? Why this trust? This straightforward availability of all God's possessions?

When I was a kid, my Mom taught me never to open the door for strangers. But when Uncle Joe or cousin Johnny or other close relatives came and we checked the window near the door, the door was thrown open and it was "mi casa su casa" all the way! Not only does God open the door for us; Jesus hands us the keys and gleefully says: "Apna ghar sumjheaa!" Make yourself at home!"

MORNING ARRIVAL: During the first two days of school, August 27th and 28th, students will gather in the school parking lot near the signs indicating grade levels. The teachers will organize the students into correct homerooms. After August 28th, please respect our "NO TRAFFIC ZONES" around the school. 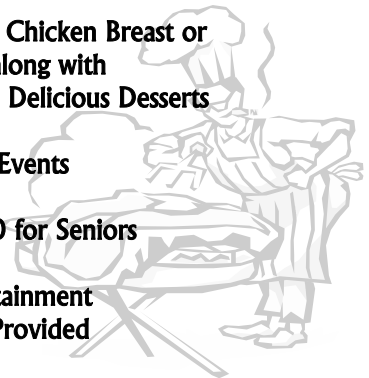
