### Feast of the Holy Family

**“Father in heaven, creator of all, you ordered the earth to bring forth life and crowned its goodness by creating the family of all humans. In history’s moment when all was ready, you sent your Son to dwell in time, obedient to the laws of life in our world. Teach us the sanctity of human love, show us the value of family life, and help us to live in peace with all peoples that we may share in your life forever.”**

This is our prayer through Christ Our Lord Your Son, Who with You and the Spirit is God, and through Whom You have chosen all peoples to see You as You are, because they shall be like You! Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!

(Taken from the opening prayer of today’s Eucharist.)

Our families are living Sacraments of God’s Trinitarian presence in the world. It is not an afterthought which we concoct to try to give human family-life a “divine” meaning. No. Family-life was intended by God to be the lived experience of God’s own inner life. The query: “What is God like?” or “How can I know God?” comes from an unwillingness to allow God the intimacy which He/She was motivated by in creating us.

To be honest, we find it easier relating to a God Who remains at some distance from us – a God we can hold at arm’s length. We want a savior, a protector, a rescuer, a God who is powerful and just, rewarding good and punishing, in no uncertain terms (!), evil.

What we are presented with is a “Family-God,” a God who reveals Mystery in the prosaic events and inter actions of hu-

man family-life. God has made it impossible for any human-being to claim ignorance of the most intimate aspects of Divine Life. Easier to deny the reality of human love and the relationships it creates. Easier to say: “I don’t have a father; I don’t have a mother; I dropped down onto the earth from the sky!!?”

Some people are terrified by the prospect of death. How utterly strange! They say: “I don’t know what God is like! All I know is what I have experienced this side of death.” Good for you! Family life is the Sacrament of God’s plan for us. Some people think that when they die they’ll be given a long, white gown and a harp and told to take up a place in the “heavenly choir” where they’ll spend eternity “praising God.” WHOA!!

Do you think that Mary and Joseph have separate quarters in heaven and all the family love they experienced in this world was lost when they died? Do you think they go to visit Jesus in His royal palace once in a while to share a meal and tell stories about how it was on earth? Or are they, in some mysterious but real way still FAMILY. Did being a family on earth prepare them for the joy of heaven? I’d like to think so.

And when we see God – whatever that’s going to mean - we will not at all be surprised. It will be what God has already put into our human-divine DNA. We might just go right on doing what we’re doing now!

O my God!!! What are we doing now!?

### **Advent Outreach Projects at St. Juliana School**

Advent is the season of waiting and preparation for the arrival of God's Son, Jesus. Part of the preparation that St. Juliana School students are making during this Advent season is to reach out to others in need of help.

The students in the first through fourth grades collected "new" stuffed animals. These toys were distributed to children who are being treated in the Emergency Room at Swedish Covenant Hospital during the Christmas holiday. These stuffed animals made the visit to the hospital a little less frightening for many children.

The Night Ministry ([www.thenightministry.org](http://www.thenightministry.org)), which provides services for the most vulnerable adults and youth in Chicago, is the organization that the fifth and sixth grade students wanted to help. The students collected hats, scarves, and gloves and were distributed to needy adults through The Night Ministry.

The Junior High students chose to help the Ronald McDonald House in Maywood, Illinois near Loyola Hospital. The Ronald McDonald House provides a place to stay for families of children undergoing treatment for serious illnesses or injuries at Loyola Hospital and other hospitals in the Chicago area. The students collected items that are on the "wish list" for the Ronald McDonald House. Some of the items that they collected are powdered laundry and dish detergent, 8-gallon trash bags, and gift cards for Jewel, Target and Costco.

The students of St. Juliana School found the words in the beautiful prayer by St. Francis of Assisi "for it is in giving that we receive," were words to live by and helped them prepare for the coming of Jesus on Christmas Day.

Under the direction of Todd Steffen, the scouts and their families did a great job washing all the pews and kneelers.

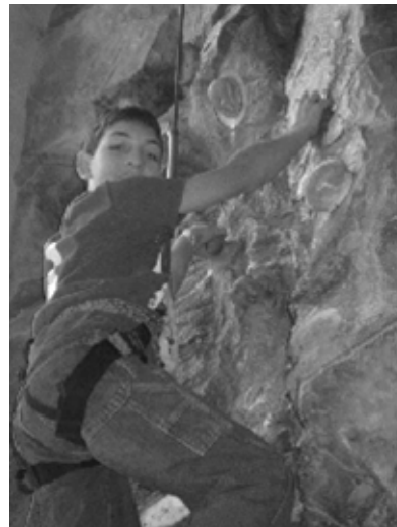


**News from St. Juliana Boy Scout Troop 965**

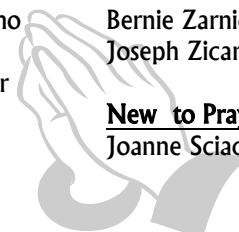

### Watch Relevant Radio - 950 AM

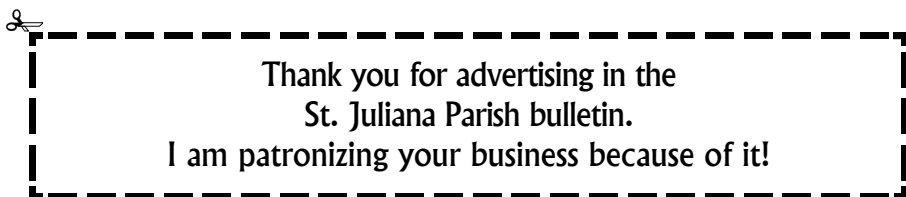
