

Pastor's Report

Upcoming Repairs

In last Sunday's bulletin I presented a six month report on parish finances, mentioned the positive news of an upcoming antenna installation from mobile phone company *T-Mobile*, and ended with the reminder of our upcoming parish projects collections which are used for capital repairs on our buildings.

As I mentioned there are a number of areas on all our buildings that are in serious need of repairs. Because it would be difficult to spell out all the problem areas in an article and because they say that a picture is worth a thousand words, you can find pictures of all the problems we face on our web site. The web site will give us the ability to show exactly what we are dealing with and the final repairs when they can get done. The pictures are broken up into sections highlighting the various buildings. And you will find "estimates" of what these are likely to cost, though prices will increase as time goes on and if other issues are discovered.

Many of the problems, as you will see, are tuck pointing issues which have arisen because of the vibrations in our structures due to the heavy truck traffic on Touhy Ave. Even our newest building, The Donald Ahearn Activity Center is encountering many such problems as the mortar is shaken out of the building.

I cannot say which of the projects we will actually work on for an obvious reason. When we take up the collections we will know how much money we have to spend on the repairs. Then depending on how much we collect we will choose the project that falls in that cost range, and which is the most critical.

Remember these repairs are the more major capital repairs. In all of the buildings and on our grounds there are constant smaller repairs which we are always doing, or hoping to do if we have money. For example last month the water pipe going into the Parish Center burst and needed to be immediately repaired. It cost \$12,000, but those are considered ordinary maintenance and repairs and are a part of our ordinary budget. Some of these types of repairs are also being put on hold depending on how critical they are and the money we have available.

Blacktop Ball

As you might remember from articles and other information in the bulletin we had moved our two major fundraisers to one large fundraiser. The Steak Fry was the major school fundraiser and the Parish Birthday Party was the one major Parish fundraiser. These have been combined to a new fundraiser called **The Black Top Ball**. The proceeds from this event will be divided between the Parish and School and used to fund our ordinary expenses. Fundraising is an ordinary activity which allows us to run all of our ministries. We hope that everyone will support our Parish fundraiser. Even if you cannot attend perhaps you can help with a prize or some other donation. What New Experience of God's Loving Guidance Have I Felt This Lent?

"Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit."

The interesting thing about Scripture inspired by the Holy Spirit is that it is ever-new, ever-fruitful. Some people might find the Scripture boring or repetitious. They've heard the biblical events and stories over and over again and seem to have an attitude: "O yeah. I know what the lesson of that story or character is!"

Even the Liturgical Year can easily become routine and over-familiar, if we do not invoke and surrender to the Spirit - that same Spirit who conceived Jesus in the womb of Mary and allowed us to see God in Human-Divine terms, which would come alive for us. Reading or listening to Holy Scripture is much like listening to a familiar piece of music. At first, we have an "Oh yes. I've heard that before!" reaction, but then something inside of us, some previously un-attended to combination of sounds or rhythms, evokes new feelings or images or inner-movements. We may even be surprised - even shocked - that we had not attended to those experiences before.

Lent can be like that. For example, I was reflecting on today's Good News about the seed that has to die before it can bear fruit. The example has always seemed rather straight forward to me; an agriculture image easily understood by Jesus' rural followers. But today, for some reason known only to the Holy Spirit I said to myself: "This is referring to our literal deaths. We are, each of us, seeds planted in the womb of the Earth-Mother. It is necessary for us to die before we can bear fruit."

Now, I'm not just referring to a figurative dying "like a seed," but to the literal reality which is the destiny of all humans: DEATH! Somehow or other, at that instant of my prayer-contemplation, human death my death! - seemed to be the fulfillment of why I am here. In other words, in the present economy of things which God has ordained, it is only in dying that my life's fruit becomes available to the universe, to all creation. In dying, the seed of my life, planted in the womb of Reality, reaches the fruitfulness which was its destiny from the moment of my conception.

I recall the words of Jesus as remembered by the disciples on the way to Emmaus: **WAS IT NOT NECESSARY THAT THE CHRIST SHOULD SUFFER THESE THINGS AND ENTER INTO HIS GLORY?** Is death not the fruitful completion of a seed-life begun in our Mothers' wombs? Is it, perhaps, only in death the true fruitfulness of our lives enters into the main-stream of the life of the world.

Is the true value and fruitfulness of our lives and **AFTER-DEATH** experience? Perhaps it is in the dying that we will find life!

In the Gospel, Jesus makes it clear that he was sent by the Father to die for our sins. A voice from heaven confirms this.
