Well, now that that’s over, we can get back to “ordinary
time” and the usual routines of our lives. After all the

“hoopla,” the liturgical dust settles, and we can again resume
our lives, lived in the shadow of the various tombs which
create darkness in the world of our families and countries.

Is anything different because Jesus is risen from the dead?
Will anything be different in my personal year ahead because
Jesus is risen from the dead? The celebrations of Lent and
Easter are not mere memories of what God did. They are a
perduring reality of what God is doing. The Liturgy makes
the Mysteries of the life of Jesus ever new and ever-accessible
to all human beings.

In a real sense, we never leave the Mysteries of the Passion,
Death, and Resurrection of Jesus. They are present, etched
into the lives of all humans from the beginning of their con-
ception in the mind and heart of God. The Mystery of Jesus
Christ was-is-in the mind of God from the moment God was
“conscious of being God,” if we may be allowed that kind of
statement to emphasize the fact that we are not an “after-
thought” of God. God does not have “before-thoughts” of
“after-thoughts.” God only is!!

The Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus are an on-
going Mystery. Human history reveals that truth.

In the 17th chapter of St. John’s Good News, we hear Jesus:
“Father! You have given them to me, and I want them to be
with me where I am, so that they may see my glory, the
glory you gave me; for you loved me before the world was
made...I made you known to them, and I will continue to do
so, in order that the love you have for me may be in them,
and so that I also may be in them.”

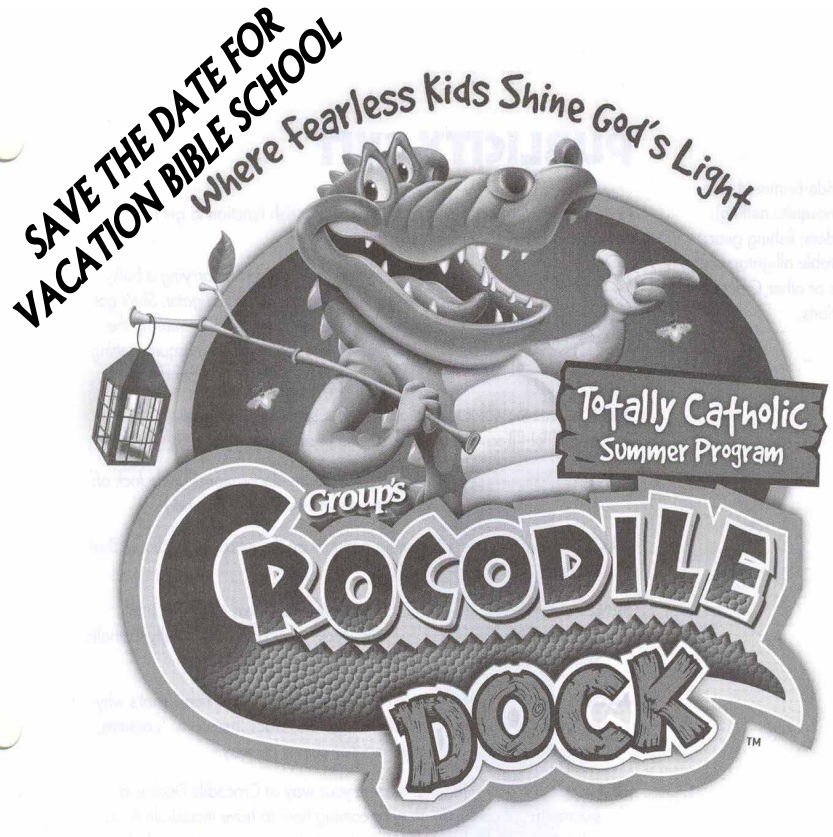

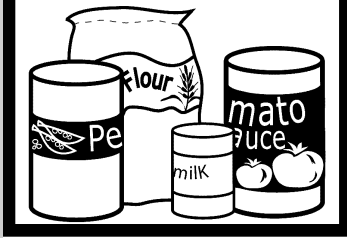

A third feature, called Randomizer, spotlights introductory text from a random section of the site; it's a nice way to discover something new about our parish community.

The entire web site is an in-house effort, so your patience and understanding are appreciated as we work out any unexpected bugs.

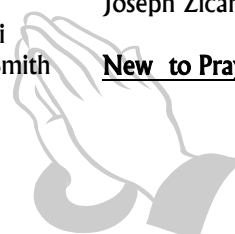
