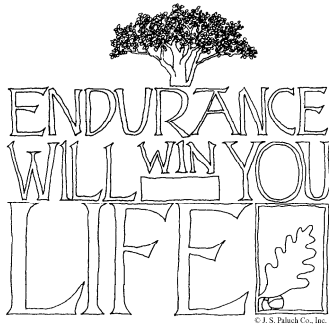
### St. Juliana Parish Pastoral Council Commission Meeting

Our Christmas Sharing Program began 29 years ago and has grown every year. It is a wonderful way of sharing Christmas gifts with those less fortunate than ourselves.

Once again we will have the opportunity to help at three different locations:

- Babies of teenage mothers and fathers who are involved in the Roseland Adolescent Parent Program.
- Men and women who are helped through the Catholic Charities Shelter Program.

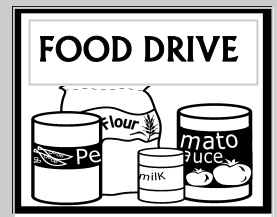

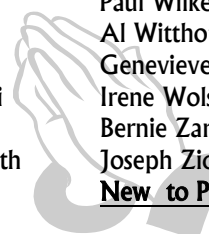
